

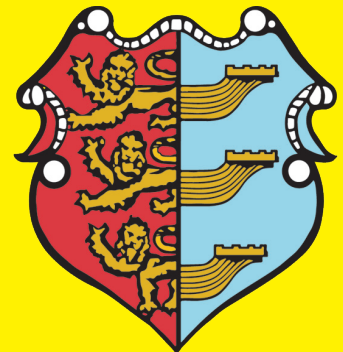

HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF BRIGHTLINGSEA REGENT



Brightlingsea Regent, previously Brightlingsea United, have completed around 100 years of competitive football. Firstly, in the Border league, between **1908/1909** to **1970** when they joined The Essex Senior league for 20 years having much success, before going on to join the then Jewson League in **1990** and then back to the Border league in **2001/2002**. Brightlingsea United FC and Regent Park Rangers FC amalgamated at the start of **2005/2006** season to become Brightlingsea Regent Football Club. During this time, the squad and club have continued to grow and develop, having success in the Border league Division 1 and cup.

In **2009/2010** new Management team James Webster and Mark Gridley guided Regent to a 4th place finish and followed up the following season in **2010/2011** by winning the Kent Blaxill Premier border league in a superb season by playing 34, winning 31, drawing 2 and losing just 1 game.

In season **2011/2012**, James Webster added Tom Rothery to the Management team in September and they finished their first season back at step 6 with a creditable 5th place finish. They also reached the quarter-final of the Essex Senior Cup before losing to League 2 side Dagenham & Redbridge. The **2012/2013** season was successful for many reasons. Firstly, an FA Vase cup run, which was the longest in the clubs history before bowing out in round 3 (last 64). The club gained promotion back to step 5 and the Premier Division with a third-place finish which included a 22-game unbeaten run during the season. In the final game of the season the team won the First Division KO Cup final with a 1-0 victory over Gt Yarmouth.

The **2013/2014** season in the Eastern Counties Premier Division again proved to be successful for Brightlingsea, gaining promotion after finishing Runners-up to Hadleigh Utd, losing out on the final day by goal difference. The club also reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and in doing so again created history.

The **2016/2017** season saw Brightlingsea Regent crowned as champions of the Isthmian North Division, notching up an impressive 103 points and finishing 12 points ahead of their closest rivals, ensuring an historic promotion to the Isthmian Premier League.

In October 2017 long-standing manager James Webster left the club to be replaced by former assistant manager and coach Tom Rothery, assisted by Pip Boyland, who maintained the R's Isthmian Premier league standing and won the Essex FA's Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup.

2018/2019 saw the Regent achieve their highest ever finish in the non-league pyramid, along with their best ever FA Cup and FA Trophy runs. They also retained the Tolleshunt D'Arcy Memorial Cup with a 1-0 victory at Maldon & Tiptree.

After Tom Rothery stepped down from the manager's position in September **2019**, Colchester United legend Kem Izzet took the hot seat and avoided relegation in his first season in charge, In a season that was cut short in February due to Covid-19.

2020/2021 A later than usual start to the season saw Regent make an early management change as Kem Izzet departed the club in October, replaced with the management duo of Tom Austin and Ryan Salter, arriving from FC Clacton. The season was then curtailed in December and no more football was played.

2021/2022 Tom Austin and Ryan Salter resigned from their positions at the beginning of November with the club positioned within the relegation places. The R's appointed Brett Munyard and his team of Mark Healy, Ricky Stubbs and Dave Limber who dramatically saved the club from relegation on the penultimate game of the season with a 3-0 victory over Haringey Borough to secure Step 3 football for the 6th season.

2022/2023 Brightlingsea Regent suffered their first relegation under the Regent name, finishing bottom of the Isthmian Premier Division following a 6-year spell.

2023/2024 saw the Regent start life back in the Isthmian North Division. Mid-season, Ryan Salter returned as Assistant Manager and the R's finished the season strong with a final position of 8th in the league.

Haringey Borough 0 Brightonsea Regent 2 - Isthmian North League

Boro failed to pick up their first league points of the season falling to defeat against a dangerous Brightonsea side who scored a goal in each half to secure the victory.

After Oujdi's red card last week a reshuffle was required and Boro lined up:

Five minutes before kick off the heavens opened and with the crowd huddled into the stand and covered terracing the visitors kicked off and quickly went on the front foot. Reuben was in the action several times early, having to make smart saves, much of the time from Boro being sloppy in possession and giving the ball away in dangerous areas. When Brightonsea took the lead on 16 minutes they had also had a shot cannon back off the post into Reuben's grasp. The goal itself though was too easy. Brightonsea were awarded a free kick on the left. The ball was played in and dropped on the penalty spot where Shabazz-Edwards was on hand to sweep the ball home.

At least that seemed to perk Boro up and it was noticeable they started to get more pressure on the ball, a bit more bite in the tackle, and slowly a bit better possession and territory. As the half wore on Boro created the better chances, and although maybe should have already been further behind, wouldn't gone into half time wondering how they hadn't scored.

A wicked cross from Balliu was met by Asamoah, 8 yards out with a thumping header that was just too close to the keeper. Derek gathered the ball from the parry but, with his back to goal couldn't get a clean second shot away and Brightonsea scrambled the ball away from the goal line.

Asamoah was close again minutes later, beating the offside trap but only able to tamely flick wide as the keeper came to the edge of his area to narrow the angles. Then it was Sambu's turn to miss a good chance. Ebz took a second opportunity to cross and the ball fell to Sambu at the far post. Only scrambling defenders prevented him scoring as his shot looped wide off a deflection.

Despite these chances the visitors still posed a threat with their best effort coming courtesy of another Boro slip. Cutting in from the right, though, the forward could only drag a shot wide of the far post.

After having what looked like a decent penalty shout turned down, Boro had one more good chance before half time, and it fell again to Sambu. Tosin reached a through ball at the same time as the keeper and the ball popped up to Sambu lurking, unmarked near the penalty spot. The ball was at a slightly awkward height, and on his weaker foot, and he couldn't quite get over the ball and keep his first time effort under the bar.

The second half had barely started before Brightonsea almost doubled their lead. The sound of a 30 yard shot crashing off a crossbar will always be a delight, and thankfully for Boro this wasn't followed by any celebrations, the ball thumping down into the 6 yard box for Reuben to gather.

It wasn't too long before Tom started making changes. After J'Ardell had stabbed a shot wide Yeboah and Agyemang were introduced for Nicolaou and Balliu as Boro looked to get on the front foot more. But the game was getting bitty. Brightonsea were happy to nullify anything Boro tried, often slightly cynically and took a couple of bookings for a foul and preventing Boro taking a quick free kick.

And the tactics largely worked as Boro couldn't get any real head of steam up. In fits and starts opportunities were nearly there, with the clearest being a corner that Sambu headed wide of the upright.

Nicolaides and Bani came on for Ennin and Sambu who had both had solid games but the game continued in the fashion it had done since half time.

Brightlingsea's best chance in this period came from a low cross. It went beyond Rabstein and as attackers ran in J'Ardell was just able to sort his feet out in time to divert the ball which Reuben then dropped on to snuff out the danger.

As the game went into the final 15 minutes Aresti shot wildly over after a pull back found him unmarked 15 yards from goal.

And then came the decisive moment in the game. Rabstein had to make a save but couldn't prevent the ball going for a corner. The planned corner routine was drilled low, about 10 yards out to the near post, for a Brightonsea sub to sweep the ball across into the far post, leaving Boro with a mountain to climb for the last 10 minutes.

And it proved too high. A couple of half chances aside, a J'Ardell header tipped over, and a final Ebz shot blocked nothing clear cut emerged and the visitors saw the game out.

Despite last weekend's victory, it also leaves Boro searching for their first league goal.

Onto Tilbury on Bank Holiday Monday.

A frustrating start.

After failing to score or pick up a point from the opening 2 league games Boro travelled to South Essex looking to kick start their league season.

In contrast to the glorious weather Boro's start was anything but bright. Tilbury went on the front foot from the off and Boro seemed to have little answer. Under pressure and being made to defend it was little surprise when the hosts took the lead after 4 minutes. Like Saturday, an attacking free kick was their undoing, and it was an opposing centre half again. This time twisting round to flick a header past a committed Rabstein.

It could have been worse before Boro started to find their feet. First, they managed to scramble a ball clear after a defensive mis-communication, then further disorganisation forced Reuben into a last ditch save. The resulting corner headed over. Manny had Boro's first effort soon after but his shot was straightforward for the keeper.

After Tilbury had narrowly missed adding to their lead from a corner, they did double the advantage on 25 minutes. Boro were out of shape and an emphatic far post header put the hosts 2 up.

And finally Boro started to play better. Tilbury had to work hard in defence to prevent Boro getting a clear shot from a corner, then Alex forced a rushed backpass, and Derek narrowly missed charging down the keeper's clearance.

Ebz then won a freekick near the angle of the box. The kick flicked behind for a corner. Sambu couldn't climb high enough from the set piece and his header went wide.

As we went into added time Boro had a golden opportunity to reduce the deficit. Tosin cut in from the right and as a defender went to clear his pull back, George nipped in from his blind side, was caught and the referee pointed to the spot.

Derek stepped up, drilled the kick just to the left of centre, but the keeper had guessed right, with Derek unable to control an awkward rebound before the defenders recovered.

A final half chance saw Dan, under pressure, unable to get any power on a header.

The second half looked as if it might begin exactly as the first had. Within 30 seconds Reuben had made a terrific low save after Boro were exposed in the left back area.

The fact it didn't follow the same pattern as the first half almost came out of nowhere. Cutting in from the left, 25 yards out Manny decided to try his luck, And what a try it was. The ball whistled past the keeper into the top corner, and Boro were now back in the game, and had a first league goal in just over 225 minutes of action.

But that hope took an almost immediate knock back. A free kick was conceded centrally 25 yards out. A superb effort beat Reuben but hit the inside of the post and went back across goal where an onrushing attacker was composed enough to tuck away.

Boro were playing better though. Derek spun in the area but the angle was against him as he shot straight at the keeper. George had a better chance from the edge of the area but skied his effort.

the game started to get broken up, first by a couple of injury breaks, then as the inevitable substitutions started. Tilbury made a couple, then with 20 to go Fred came on for Richard.

If Tom's intention was for an impact sub, he got it. Reuben got down well to stop a shot from the edge of the box. Quick as a flash he was up and bowled the ball out to Aresti. George played Alex in on the right. Alex took a couple of touches, looked up, made half a yard then swung in the most delicious cross. Fred had got between the centre halves and was there to head towards goals. It seemed to take an age for the ball to hit the ground, bounce up onto the underside of the bar and final nestle in the back of the net, but once again Boro were back in it.

However, the home side were not content to just sit back. They won another free kick near the Boro area.

Again, it was taken direct, and again, it hit the woodwork. The fact it did, and did not re-establish a 2 goal lead, was down to a flying Reuben who magnificently turned the ball onto the bar. The luck was with him this time and the danger went away.

With 5 minutes to go Demmy replaced George and Tilbury looked happy to try and soak up a bit of pressure and hit Boro on the break.

Despite this Boro couldn't fashion that one chance. The ball popped up to Tosin in the area but it span awkwardly off his head as he tried to head for goal.

Added time came as Caleb came on for Ebz and the Boro faithful were hoping for one final chance. It came and went in a flash. Fred drove forward and as the defenders retreated he pulled back towards Demmy running in from deep. But as he reached the ball a defender flung himself in the path of his goalbound effort. Boro did foray forward once more but as they won a throw near the corner flag in the 8th minute of added time the final whistle blew.

Next, it's back to FA Cup action on Saturday 31st August as Boro travel to Brightlingsea Regent.

Boro and Brightlingsea battled in blustery conditions to set up an FA Cup Replay at Coles Park on Tuesday 3rd September.

Having fallen at home to the same opposition in the league last weekend this was another improved performance from this largely new side.

The game started slowly with neither side able to exert any real control. Boro did force a couple of corners in this period but failed to make any chance of note. Demmy was booked early after a late challenge.

The first half chance fell to the hosts, calling Reuben into action for the first time. He parried a low cross and Dan was on hand to complete the clearance ahead of an attacker.

And then, Boro scored, and it was strike of quality we hadn't see in the game up to now.

Fred battled for the ball in the box and under pressure Brightlingsea's defence could only clear to the edge of the area. Manny was positioned perfectly to step onto the ball and strike first time beyond the keeper's dive for his 3rd goal of the season.

Soon after it should have been 2. Derek beat the offside trap, took an extra touch rounding the keeper and scrambling defenders were able to get back to block in the six yard box.

On 20 minutes Reuben was in action again, flying to his right to push away a shot from the edge of the area. But neither side was really on top. For the next 10 minutes or so it was fairly bitty with no goalmouth action. In the final 15 minutes things did perk up. After Reuben punched a corner clear he was helped out by a defenders block on the follow up.

At the other end a ball just bounced away from Manny at the far post after more good work from Fred.

The final 5 minutes were the most promising period for the host so far. A loose Boro pass got Brightlingsea in on Boro's left but the final shot from a narrow angle went wide, and Boro were also made to defend a series of corners, with Reuben again, playing a leading roll in a Boro player getting the first touch.

Two added minutes brought no other chances and Boro led at the break.

With no changes at the break the first half chance went to Boro. Manny, off balance, couldn't keep his shot down.

Before the hour Boro had forced a couple of saves following corners. From a Boro one Richard's deflected effort was simply saved. Then, from a Brightlingsea corner Boro counter attacked but again, the final shot lacked the power and direction it needed.

On the hour came the first real scare for Boro. Reuben first, then a flying Dan blocked shots in quick succession. The hosts were starting to enjoy a better period of possession as Aresti replaced Asamoah. Another block, from another corner whistled wide and Boro, bar trying to play on the break, were having to work hard to prevent any clear cut chances being created.

But that's what they did. After one break ended with Richard a little isolated, with 20 minutes left the lead was almost doubled.

This time Boro got downfield in better numbers. Dan got it started and the ball arrived at Aresti in midfield. He spotted Ebz on the left and floated a perfect ball to him. Ebz stood up his marker, cut inside and shot. The ball curled and dipped towards the far post, leaving the keeper stranded but cannoned back off the bar to safety.

As the game entered the final 15 minutes Ademiluyi came on for Fred – a word for Fred whose work rate against two giant centre halves was excellent, and he was unlucky not to draw free kicks on a few occasions that would have given Boro a bit more breathing space.

Boro had the next half chances. An Aresti corner caught the wind to force the keeper to stretch to palm wide, then the home defence were well positioned to cut out J'Ardell's pull back.

And then with 10 minutes remaining the pressure that Brightlingsea had exerted more through the second half paid dividends. An attacker skipped past a couple of challenges and with Boro exposed a cross to the far post was nodded past a stranded Reuben.

Sambu was then the second Boro player booked after abruptly halting another break on the right.

Alex was introduced for Demmy for the final 5 minutes as Boro tried to push higher up the pitch, and it largely worked. The game got bitty again, but it relieved the pressure that had built before the equaliser.

Including the 5 minutes of added time Aresti's tame shot from distance was the only noteworthy effort.

So it ends 1-1 and both sides do it all again on Tuesday. By then we will know the potential opponents with the Second Qualifying Round Draw due to be published on Monday 2nd at 13.00

Haringey Borough 1 Luton Town 4 – Women's Eastern Region League

What started promisingly for Boro turned into a long afternoon in the blazing sunshine at Coles Park. After taking an early lead, then hitting the woodwork Luton were ahead by halftime and then added a couple more in the second half to put the game beyond doubt.

Boro were ahead within 5 minutes. After Luton had flashed an early effort over Jada was fouled 25 yards out, slightly right of centre. Chloe stepped up and whipped the ball beyond the wall and it hit the back of the net before the keeper could react.

Luton kept pressing and gradually looked to be getting on top, had nothing on target to show for it and it was Boro who next came closest.

Jada won another free kick, in a similar position but a little wider. Chloe again stepped up but this time the keeper threw her hands up and parried the ball onto the bar.

And in truth, that's about as good as it got for Boro in the first half. As Boro sat back and looked to play on the break Luton looked increasingly dangerous.

Liamara, in goal, was called on several times as Luton found their range, with Boro having to last ditch defend too often, and by half time they'd turned the game around.

First, a through ball beat the offside trap for a simple close range finish, then a clumsy challenge in the area conceded a penalty which was confidently dispatched.

The second half was played in much the same vein. Boro could not hold decent possession in forward area, with the front 3 being well marshalled by the visiting back line.

It wasn't too long before Luton had doubled their lead. Another run to beat the offside trap was neatly finished under a diving Liamara.

As the pace of the game slowed and more space opened up it was Luton who continued to offer the main threat. Liamara made two more saves when one on one to keep the score respectable, but couldn't prevent Luton adding a late 4th. A high corner curled in beat everyone and hit the far post. The ball bounced up on the goal line and was stabbed in at the second attempt.

Boro survived one more scare, defending a free kick after Liamara unfortunately carried the ball outside of the area but saw out the game with no further setback.

ANOTHER ALL ISTHMIAN NORTH TIE AWAITS THIS EVENING'S VICTORS

Its always a little disappointing when the FA Cup draw pairs teams from the same Division of the same League, thus denying the opportunity of meeting relatively unknown opponents; but such has happened again for on Saturday 14th September the winner of this evening's replay will entertain Witham Town in the 2nd. Qualifying Round. It is unlikely that we ever met Witham Town before we became Isthmians in 2015 as they had previously played only in Leagues with membership restricted to Essex and Suffolk Clubs so have probably met Brightlingsea Regent from time to time in those Leagues. At First Team level we have now played them 7 times (3 wins each and 1 Draw) and 8 times in the now discontinued Isthmian Development Section. They have made a fine start to this season with 7 points from 3 games and have already eliminated one North Division Club by 4-1 away to Grays Athletic in the Preliminary Round. They did not get a bye in the Extra Preliminary Round in which they won at home to Hertford Town by 2-1. Clearly, a stern test awaits the Replay winners on 14th September. Its not the first time we have been drawn together in the FA Cup and they were comfortable winners at Coles Park in 2016.

PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

Like us, our visitors are the outcome of a series of name changes and mergers. One of their eventual components, Brightlingsea Town, was in existence in 1908 - possibly earlier than that, so we are of roughly the same vintage with Tufnell Park having been formed in 1907. It was not until both teams had become Isthmian League members, Brightlingsea in 2014/15 and us a season later, that the Clubs first met; unsurprisingly as prior to that they had competed only in Leagues for which membership was restricted to East Anglian Clubs. The clubs have been in the same Division of the Isthmian League for seven of the last ten

seasons but because of Covid only 13 League games have been played. However, being paired up in three knock out competitions has brought the total up to 16. Four have been drawn, Brightlingsea have won four and Borough eight. Borough have scored 30 goals, Brightlingsea 17. There were also 5 development North Division meetings before that Section of the League was discontinued. The individual games and results are in the Chart below. In recent years the Clubs have followed similar trajectories for as well as becoming Isthmians in the following season, as mentioned above, we followed them down from Step 3 into Step 4 one season after they were relegated. Losing Step 3 status last season was a blow for us but it does mean that we will become re-acquainted with a number of Clubs whose hospitality is superb, not least Brightlingsea where we were made very welcome just 3 days ago and we look forward to our next visit which will be for our last League game of the season.

HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



MICHAEL ACQUAH – A goalkeeper who has played for Huddersfield Town's U19s and B Team, Farsley Celtic on loan and Norwich U21s

WILLIAM ADEMILUYI – A forward, William was with Burton Albion's U18s last season.

EBENEZER ADDO KUFOUR – Ebenezer played over 30 games for us last season mainly occupying the right back position he is versatile and was asked to perform other roles across the defence.

FRED AGYEMANG – Centre forward Freddie joins the Boro after finishing last season at Concord Rangers. He has also played for Ilford.

GEORGIOS ARESTI – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal. Since leaving the Boro he has appeared for Cheshunt, Brightlingsea Regent and became the all-time top goal scorer for New Salamis.

AKILJO BALLIU – A winger, Akiljo joins from Clapton, he has also played for Great Wakering Rovers, AC Milano's and Redbridge Community.

BOBSON BAWLING – Bobson has had two spells with the Boro, a winger who previously played over 70 games in the football league for Crawley Town, scoring 6 goals. Other clubs Bobson has played for include Woking, Torquay United, Oxford City, St Albans City, Enfield Town, and Hendon. Known for his versatility, Bobson can play in various midfield positions and has also been deployed as a right-back.

TOMMY BOXER – An experienced centre back, Tommy was player-manager at New Salamis during the 2023/2024 season.

DAN CAREY-EVANS – Dan was on loan at the Boro from Cambridge United last season but has now registered to play this season, a centre half, he joined the Cambridge United Academy at the age of 13 after spending a significant part of his childhood in Spain.

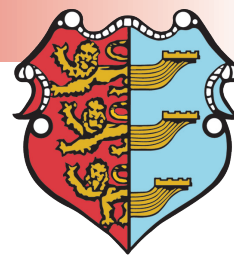
