HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF BARKING FC



Our renaissance started when Mick O'Shea and Rob O'Brien took us into third place in the Essex Senior League in 2014/15 and the winning the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy. This progress was maintained in 2016/17 when Glen Golby and Steve Willis led us to win the Essex Senior League championship and promotion back to the Isthmian League. Our present manager Justin Gardner took us to tenth place in 2017/18, thus justifying our promotion and our highest finish since 2005/06.

EARLY DAYS

The ancient abbey town and fishing port of Barking has been represented by a football team since at least 1880 and we are the longest established football club borough of Barking and Dagenham. Barking's colours of Royal Blue are said to originate from the Short Blue fishing fleet which plied the oceans from Barking Creek for many years and supplied London with fish.

In 1880 the Barking Rovers club was formed, playing on Eastbury Field, and is known to have existed until at least 1890. The Vicarage Field ground was opened in 1884 with a match against Ilford which Rovers won 2-0 but in 1889 Barking Rovers were accused of damaging the Vicarage Field cricket pitch and were forced to return to Eastbury Field. Barking Woodville from Forest Gate became known as Barking Woodville and moved to the Vicarage Field in 1896 and appear to have disbanded in 1900 when the Vicarage Field lease expired. The Vicarage Field was then occupied by Barking Institute, formed in at least 1896 as Barking Working Lads' Institute, as the local Church Institute were involved in running it with the name being changed to Barking Institute. Barking Institute's name changed to Barking in 1902. The name was changed again to Barking Town from 1919 to 1932, reverting to Barking until 2001 when changed again to Barking and East Ham United for five seasons.

The club progressed to the South Essex League from 1900/01 and the London League from 1909/10, playing in both for several seasons (leagues were smaller in those days). In 1912 their application to join the Isthmian League was rejected but they had been founder members of the Athenian League in 1911, resigning after only two matches, having been fined for not fielding the strongest possible team, and not rejoining until 1923. During the Second World War matches in the South Essex Combination were played at the Merry Fiddlers Ground, Dagenham as the Vicarage Field was converted to an anti-aircraft site and all matches in 1945/46 were played away.

ISTHMIAN LEAGUE YEARS

Barking were invited to join the Isthmian League in 1952 and in 1978/79 under Eddie McCluskey won the championship and were named FA Non-League team of the year. Floodlights were installed at the Vicarage Field in 1958 and Barking was the first club to play an Isthmian League match under its own lights. In 1973 Barking were required to leave the Vicarage Field by the council and were leased the present ground. In June 1990 the Isthmian league's ground grading committee deemed that Mayesbrook Park was unfit for Premier division football and at the league's AGM there was a vote whether or not to relegate Barking which was won by eight votes. However, this was a temporary reprieve as in the next season after 39 years at Premier Division level, the club suffered the first relegation in its history and in 1996 relegated to Division 2. Promotion back to Division 1 was won in 2000/01. Following restructuring Barking played in the Southern League Division 1 East in 2004/05 and 2005/06, reaching the play offs in both seasons. In 2007, following the tragic death of chairman Peter Webster in late 2004 and the subsequent liquidation of the parent company, the club was demoted to the Essex Senior League in 2006.

CUP SUCCESS

Barking's lost 3-1 to Leyton at Millwall FC in the 1926/27 FA Amateur Cup final, and a total of ten appearances in the last eight of the Amateur Cup was made, from which we progressed to one final and three semi-finals. We have played in the FA Cup since 1895/96, but Oxford United are the only professional club's first team who has been defeated in a 1979 FA Cup tie, in two ties against Gillingham separated by 55 years the professionals required two matches on each occasion to progress. We have reached the second round proper a total of four times. In the FA Vase in 1996/97 Barking reached the fifth round (last 16) and were narrowly

defeated by a single goal at Mossley. The Essex Senior Cup final has been reached 14 times, of which seven were won, and the London Senior Cup has been won four times in seven finals. A memorable success came in 1996/97 when the Essex Thameside Trophy against Canvey Island was won with the 22nd taken from the penalty spot. Barking triumphed by 8 to 7 and the final kick was successfully converted by Uzodimma Agbasonu.

THE PROFESSIONAL GAME

Over 40 Barking players have gone on to the professional ranks and the most recently famous old boys are in no particular order: Kevin Hitchcock, Darren Purse, Lamar Reynolds, Jack Leslie (probably Barking's first black player), James Dillimore (Millwall), Harold Halse, Len Casey, Peter Carey, Mark Lazarus, Laurie Abrahams. George Shalders, Joe Hawkins and Jack Tresarden (West Ham United and capped in 1923) who played for "The Hammers" in the first Wembley cup final in 1923.

OUR BOBBY

Our most famous ex player is of course Bobby Moore, the West Ham United and World Cup winning England captain. He never played for our first team but research supported by the memories of our late president, Ron Debenham, has indicated that he played for our A (third/youth) team before being signed by West Ham at a young age. The programme for a charity match in 1969 played at the Vicarage Field states Bobby "decided to play on the pitch where he had previously appeared as a member of Barking's 'A' team". This was corroborated in 2015 by former Barking player Alan Batten, who played alongside Bobby in our A team in 1954/55 which was subsequently wound up and Bobby moved on to West Ham United. Bobby's parents had been active members of Barking FC Supporters' Club and organised the transport, comprising fleets of coaches and even a special train in those days, to away matches.

FOR THE RECORD

Among the club records is an unbeaten run of 17 games in 1968/69 which was almost matched by a run of 15 matches in 1996/97. In the light of modern complaints about fixture congestion it is of interest to note that Barking played 14 games in April 1927, losing only four of them. The club record run of unbeaten league games is 23 set by the reserves in 2011/12 which comprised the whole league season and one game from the next.

THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

We offer a warm welcome to Barking, their players, supporters and committee, we also welcome our officials, Benjamin Kelly and his assistants Paul Roberts and Stephen Poulter.

Since the last musings we have played two games and lost both 2-1, I'll start with the Maldon & Tiptree game, a game against a team around us in the table, to have lost and in dramatic fashion, injury time, almost the last kick of the game, was disappointing. Our performance was a game of two halves, first half we looked good were knocking the ball around well and once Georgios scored from a free kick, I thought we were going to kick on and score more. Sadly, we didn't and offered very little in the second half, Maldon grew into the game and it was no surprise they equalised. It looked like we were going to gain a point but after consecutive corners in injury time they made it 2-1 and, in a game, we could ill afford to lose, we lost. I'm going to state the obvious but we can't be losing to those teams around us and we have to start picking up points, we find ourselves in a relegation battle after 16 games and we must get ourselves out of this as soon as possible. We are four points off the fifth from bottom team and that gap cannot be allowed to grow much larger.

On Saturday we travelled to league leaders Bury Town, the weather gods and the fat controller did their best to stop us getting there but it will take a lot more than signal failure and trees on railway lines to stop the Boro faithful getting to a game. Again, our performance can be best categorised into the two halves, conceding a goal after a minute to a team flying high isn't actually making, what was already a difficult task, any easier. For the rest of the half, we rode our luck with the Bury Town forwards taking it in turns to miss certain goals by blazing over. As it was half time came, we were only 1-0 down and towards the end of the half we started to get the ball down and pass it around.

Given we were under the cosh for most of the first half the second half couldn't have been more different, as we came out and went for it, looking back it was an incredible half of football, end to end, back and forth and we had them absolutely rattled. Their keeper, who was given man of the match in the non-league paper, made a couple of great saves from Scott and Georgios and when Matt Young won and scored a penalty to make it 1-1 it was thoroughly deserved, there's something great about scoring away from home and the mass pile-in that follows. Given we were in the ascendancy when Bury went back ahead less than 10 minutes later it was tough to take. That meant we had less than 15 minutes to get an equaliser and we came SO close, Stephane Mgbada curling a shot from the edge of the area, that we were all in line of its flight, it was bending, curling all the way towards the goal, it was like one of those dramatic movie scenes where they slow the play down and time stands still, as it looked as though it was bending in, only for the ball to hit the post and Derek with the goal at his mercy couldn't steer his header in. Unbelievable. It felt like as soon as that passage of play had been completed that the final whistle went. No one can fault the effort of the team, they played well, gave us hope and looked a team. If we can recreate that second half performance every game we will soon be climbing the table.

The last thing to say about Saturday's game is the incredible support, in a crowd of 500 we certainly made our support heard and had fun. PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

Barking were founded in the 1880s and their interim name change and mergers certainly exceed our not inconsiderable total of such. The first meeting of the Clubs for which a record can be found was a Quarter Final tie in the FA Amateur Cup of 1909/10 in which Barking lost 1-5 at home to Tufnell Park. It was not until Haringey Borough were transferred to the Essex Senior League that the Clubs ever found themselves in the same Division of the same League, although it almost happened in the early 1950's when after Tufnell Park (Edmonton) withdrew from the Isthmian League at the end of the 1951/52 season and Barking were one of the two Clubs which were admitted the following season when the Isthmians increased their complement As well as the four Essex Senior League games we also met them in its League Cup. There was also a season, 2017/18 when both were in the Isthmian Division 1 North. So there have been just 6 League meetings and today's game will be at least the 11th Cup tussle and it would be surprising if there were not other games in years long past in the early Rounds of Cup competitions which even the wonderful Football Club History Data Base does not record.

As well as the 11 First Team games listed below (those shown in bold print) there have been many meetings between other teams of the Clubs since 2006; 20 for the Women, 10 for the Under 21/23 Development team and 1 for the Under 16s. That's 42 in all and it is doubtful if in that same period there is any Club which we have met more often.

As regards the LONDON SENIOR CUP both Clubs are no strangers to its Finals ; Barking having appeared in 7 and won 4 of them; Haringey in 4 of which 3 were won. They have never both reached the final in the same season. To check for meetings in the earlier Rounds would probably require access to every London FA annual Handbook, which has now become an on-line only publication. But we did play East ham United three times; on 8/11/80 we won 4-0 away; a home- win by 5-0 on 4.1.95 and 0-2 loss on 14.12.99 which was our final Cup game of the last century.

Both Clubs also played in the early years of the LONDON CHALLENGE CUP which was intended for the First teams of Professional Clubs (although some results clearly indicate that they did not always field such which displeased the London FA) and it was customary for four of London's top Amateur sides to be invited to enter, and that description fitted both Clubs at that time. They never met and the early year games both Clubs played are listed below. It ran from 1908/09 to 1973/74 it eventually became a Competition in which the

League Clubs entered their Reserve teams and dominated it, although some of the better Amateur sides still entered. It ended when the FA abolished the distinction between Amateurs and Professionals. It was revived in 1990/91 but lasted only 10 years before again being discontinued.

Round by round results are not readily available so it is unknown if the Clubs ever met. To finish with a triviality there was a pre-season friendly at Coles Park on 4th August 2001 when we beat Barking & East Ham United 4-2

HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



EBENEZER ADDO KUFOUR – Ebenezer played over 30 games for us last season mainly occupying the right back position he is versatile and was asked to perform other roles across the defence.

GEORGIOS ARESTI – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal. Since leaving the Boro he has appeared for Cheshunt, Brightlingsea Regent and became the all-time top goal scorer for New Salamis.

AKILJO BALLIU – A winger, Akiljo joins from Clapton, he has also played for Great Wakering Rovers, AC Milano's and Redbridge Community.

BOBSON BAWLING – Bobson has had two spells with the Boro, a winger who previously played over 70 games in the football league for Crawley Town, scoring 6 goals. Other clubs Bobson has played for include Woking, Torquay United, Oxford City, St Albans City, Enfield Town, and Hendon. Known for his versatility, Bobson can play in various midfield positions and has also been deployed as a right-back.

HAMID BEN-SEISAY – A young centre half who has played for Rotherham United's U18s and been a member of the Haringey Borough U23s team this season.

TOMMY BOXER – An experienced centre back, Tommy was player-manager at New Salamis during the 2023/2024 season.

CALEB DENNIS – A young full back who has signed from the U23s, Caleb has previously played for the West Ham Foundation and Shepherd's Bush.

JORGE DJASSI SAMBU – A huge influence on the team's success in recent years, Jorge is a centre midfielder that loves to tackle and is a commanding figure in the centre of the pitch. He has now been with the club for over 10 seasons but will always be held in the highest regard for his 2 goals in the play-off semi-final of 2018.

RICHARD ENNIN – A winger who has played for Enfield Borough and Leverstock Green, last season he made over 30 appearances for Ware.

OLIWIER FUSIEK – Centre back Oliwier impressed when stepping up from the Under 23s last season to finish the season as a first team player.

ENRIQUE KALSI – A young goalkeeper who will be looking to break into the team this season.

LOUIS MAFFIA – Louis is a centre midfield player who signed from West Essex, he impressed in trial games pre-season which earned him a place in the squad.

STEPHANE MGBADA – Stephane was a regular last season for the Under 23s, his performances earned him a call up to the first team where he made a good contribution in the games he played, scoring one goal at Potters Bar. SCOTT MITCHELL – Scott is a centre back who has been with the Boro since 2017, a huge favourite with the fans he has amassed over 200 appearances and won the supporters player of the year twice. A player who brings experience and brings a love of playing for Haringey, which is why everyone appreciates him.

ALEXANDER NICOLAIDES – The top scorer last season for the Under 23s, Alex played 10 times for the first team. A very skilful forward and only 17 years old, much is hoped that Alex can make the successful transition to first team football.

DIMITRI NICOLAOU – A dual registration signing with Chelmsford City, Dimitri plays in midfield and is always looking to get on the ball to start an attack.

UKO OJI – A young forward who joins on loan from Leyton Orient.

TOSIN OLUFEMI – Tosin returns after two seasons at Bishop's Stortford where he won the Isthmian Premier League. Tosin was Haringey's captain when we won the play off in 2018 and his return is a real coup for the club. In his previous spells he played over 150 times and was top goal scorer in 2021/2022 despite being a right back.

ALAA OUJDI – A left back who likes to get forward, Alaa spent a several seasons at Ware making over 100 appearances before joining New Salamis where he was last season, 2023/2024.

RAKIM RICHARDS – It would be easy to write a full page on the impact and influence Rakim has had on Haringey Borough, since our foundation as Haringey Borough no one has made more appearances than Rakim. Known as Raks, his first appearance was in the season 2010/2011 and has been a part of both the Essex Senior League winning team and the Isthmian North play off winning team. Club captain, Raks is currently recovering from injury and given his importance to the team, his injury played a key factor in the team suffering relegation last season.

SEAN SANKANU – Sean a centre back joins from AFC Wimbledon's academy, he also played for Corinthian Casuals on loan last season and has played a couple of times for the U23s this season.

J'ARDELL STIRLING – Despite the struggles last season Boro fans were pleased to see centre back J'Ardell re-sign for 2024-2025. Previous clubs include Walthamstow, Wingate & Finchley and Dunstable Town.

DAMILOLA TAIWO-PRATT – A centre half who joins from Dulwich Hamlet, prior to that Damilola played for Gillingham's U18s.

RUBEN TAVARES BAPTISTA – Ruben has progressed through both the Under 18 and Under 23 teams into the first team, demonstrating proof if you are good enough there is structure in place to develop at Haringey. Ruben is comfortable operating in any position down the right and has shown a determination to succeed since establishing himself in the first team squad.

JOE WAIGHT – A forward, Joe joins from Bowers & Pitsea, having also played for Averley during the 2024/2025 season. Last season Joe was top goal scorer for New Salamis. Previous clubs include Reading City and Wembley.

JACK WEST-ASTUTI - A goalkeeper from Australia, Jack joins from Aveley where he is also dual registered with Walton & Hershaw. Jack has played for a number of clubs in Australia and Italy before moving to England.

EMMANUEL YEBOAH – A forward who spent the 2023/2024 season at Wingate & Finchley.
