## HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

## HISTORY OF MILDENHALL TOWN FC



Mildenhall Town are a long-established club, formed in August 1898. Club records from the early years are vague, but it is known that the club won the Suffolk Junior Cup as long ago as 1899/1900 when they defeated Southwold R.A. Volunteers 4-0 in the final.

The club had to wait 93 years for their next County success, lifting the Cambs. Junior Cup in 1992/93 and then the Cambs Invitation Cup in 1996.

The club joined the Bury & District League in 1945, competing well in this league until joining the Cambs. County League in 1969.

After many successful years, the club was accepted into the newly established Eastern Counties League Division 1 for the 1988/89 season. After coming to terms with this higher level of football, the club finished runners-up to Clacton Town in 1999 to attain promotion to the ECL Premier Division under the guidance of the managerial team of Steve O'Donoghue, Rob Steele & Jez George. The club also reached the Suffolk Premier Cup final in 2000, losing 1-0 to Lowestoft Town.

Under the leadership of Chairman Brian Brigden, the club also underwent a major transformation during the 90's, bringing the ground up to current standards, and building the excellent clubhouse whilst still retaining an enviable central location in the town.

Trevor Munns took over the managerial hot-seat in 2001, leading to six years of consistently creditable finishing positions in the ECL Premier Division, culminating in a superb 2nd spot in 2006/2007 garnering 97 points. Unfortunately, Wroxham got 101 points that season.

'Hall again reached the Suffolk Premier Cup final in 2003, but lost to the very strong AFC Sudbury in the final at Ram Meadow. The club also had two excellent runs in the FA Vase, losing away to Hillingdon Borough in 2006 and Billingham Synthonia in 2007, both times reaching the last 16. The 2006 run included the defeat of the then Vase holders, Didcot Town, in a replay at Recway in front of a club record crowd of 320 spectators, probably the finest night in the club's history.

Martin Tuck succeeded Brian Brigden as Chairman in 2002, and he led the club through a turbulent, although largely successful period.

Trevor Munns resigned in November 2007 to be succeeded by local duo of Dave Pinkowski and Tony Lyes. The highlight of their reign was a 7-0 drubbing of Lowestoft Town, their heaviest defeat for 50 years.

This duo ended their stint during 2008/2009 and in April 2009 the club appointed former Bolton Wanderers & Norwich City star Simon Charlton as team manager. Charlton had a largely successful season in charge, culminating in a superb 3-1 victory over Wisbech Town in the Cambs Invitation Cup final at the Abbey Stadium.

Simon moved on in the summer of 2010 to be replaced by ex Woodbridge Town & Stowmarket Town boss and qualified UEFA coach Christian Appleford. Christian, ably assisted by Tom Youngs, led the team to immediate success by retaining the Cambs Invitation Cup with a 2-0 victory over Haverhill Rovers in the final and finishing a creditable 5th place in the league.

Christian left the club in November 2014 and was replaced by former Cambridge United goalkeeper Dean Greygoose.

Huge progress was made under Dean's guidance and 2015/2016 season saw the team win the Eastern Counties League Challenge Cup for the first time with a 2-1 victory over Norwich United. In 2016/2017 the league and cup double were achieved as Newmarket Town were defeated in the League Cup final, and the league title was won by the clear margin of 9 points, thus enabling promotion to the Isthmian League.

For different reasons, both Chairman Martin Tuck and Manager Dean Greygoose vacated their positions in December 2018, following an infamous home defeat to Brentwood.

Bill Flynn has stepped up to take over as Chairman of the club whilst former players Ricky Cornish and Colin Vowden were been appointed as Manager & Assistant respectively.

Relegation from the Isthmian League after two seasons saw a return to the Eastern Counties League at Step 5 for season 2019/2020.

The Covid shutdowns disrupted the teams' efforts to return to step 4, but the lull in proceedings did allow the club to upgrade the stadium with a clubhouse refurbishment and the addition of a new hospitality suite, named after Martin Law, an absolute club legend, who very sadly passed away after suffering from MND.

Ricky Cornish was replaced as manager by Phil Weavers, who became

Player manager in April 2022. After finishing a respectable 6th in Phil's first full season 2022/23, the addition of some experienced players, as well as the return of club favourites Ben Nolan and Jarid Robson, for the 2023/4 season transformed the team, and the Hall ran away with the title, winning by 14 clear points and only conceding 16 goals throughout the season, ensuring the return to the Isthmian league for 2024/25 season, after a break of 5 years.

The latest development is the installation of LED floodlights in Aug 2024, replacing the old lights that had served the club well for 29 seasons, but had become obsolete, as well as irreparable. Hopefully, this is a portent of a bright new future.

Outstanding players in recent seasons include Mat Mitchel-King, who after being sold by 'Hall to Histon in 2005, progressed into the Football League playing for Crewe Alexandra, and more recently, AFC Wimbledon. Local legend John Sands took the Eastern Counties League by storm during his time with the club, scoring a club record 31 league goals in 2010/2011 and earning himself a transfer to Bury Town. Sands' record lasted only one season however, as Andrew Wood won the coveted League Golden Boot in 2011/2012 scoring a club record of 33 league goals. Two other club legends, both still playing, are Luke Butcher who has captained the team for 10 years, and Josh Pope, who made his debut as an 18-year-old youth player, and now has well over 600 first team appearances, notwithstanding a five-year spell at Soham. Two outstanding footballers, who have been the bedrock of the club's success over the last 15 years.

Finally, the club has at last begun to develop a coherent youth section which will hopefully bode well for the future, and allow the club to continue its path of gradual sustainable progression.

## THE SECRETARY'S MUSINGS

Last Saturday the team gave a good performance away at Heybridge Swifts, despite going behind twice we showed fight to come back twice and we were the better team for much of the game, we had chances to win it as well. No one there can complain about the spirit or fight of the team, same again today please. Sadly, the game produced a couple of incidents whereby players suffered bad injuries, firstly Georgios Aresti, fell badly and dislocated his shoulder, Georgios was taken to hospital and had the shoulder put back in place, he will be out for several weeks. We obviously wish him well and for a quick return. The other incident involved the opposition goalkeeper who suffered a bad cut to his forehead following a genuine attempt by Derek for the ball, for which Derek received a red card which brings with it a 3 game ban. The keeper was out of his penalty area going for the ball with his head, there was a defender in the scramble for the ball as well and sadly, in attempting to get to the ball Derek caught the keeper. All in all, a pretty eventful game.

Looking back at the Tilbury game on New Years Day, there are only so many ways I can think of to write about throwing away leads, for anyone that has read the musings previously you will know I've said about the need for positivity round the team and club. So, let's take the positives, the two goals we scored against Tilbury were superb, Manny picking up from earlier in the season where he only scores goal of the season contenders and Derek scored with a spectacular overhead kick. As for the rest of the game, it went along the lines of nearly every home game this season, indecision at the back gifted them a first and then a mistake gave them their second. As soon as the second went in most, if not all of us, expected them to win. I was sent a stat by Roddy, one of our fans, who said we'd given up 18 points from winning positions, even taking half of those, 9 points, would see us clear of the relegation zone. We can't look back now, we can only look forward.

Going back to Saturday's game and I don't want to put too much pressure on but the return of Rakim Richards is a welcome boost for both the Club and Raks himself. Raks has been out with an ACL injury since August 2023 and whilst it will take time to get back to his best, it will be amazing to see him in the yellow and blue again. The cameo appearance at Heybridge has whetted the appetite and I look forward to joining in with, what I'm sure will be, a great reception for his Coles Park return. He is our longest serving player having been here since 2010 and in my opinion, we would not have been relegated last season if Raks had not been injured. All those points we threw away late into games last season needed a calm, composed player to see games out, and for me Raks is that player.

I want to address something that was said on Social Media about these notes and news coming out of the club in general. I'm not aiming this at the fan in question as it is a more general point. It was implied that the club were ignoring key events that had happened during and after the Basildon game, so I'd like to say that at times we can't or we feel we shouldn't talk about certain things, there is an FA investigation into the incident with the referee, so you will not find us fanning the fire or offering an opinion by making reference to it, if the ball was on the other foot we wouldn't want the opposition making comment. Then there was a comment about two players arguing on the pitch, events such as these, are events that we don't necessarily want to talk about publicly, no need to make a big deal and they can be dealt with in house. **Saturday 18th January 2025 - Cambridge City v Haringey Borough**  
**FWD-IP Community Stadium, West Way, Sawston, Cambridge, CB22 3FG**

There's two ways of doing this by public transport. Finsbury Park to Cambridge. Direct trains at 45 minutes past the hour, 1 hour 8 minutes travel to Cambridge. Bus number 7, direction Pampisford via Addenbrookes, from bus stop 3 at 18, 38 and 58 minutes past the hour. 19 stops 27 mins to Water Tower then 15 minutes (0.7 miles) walk to ground.

For those going via Cambridge, I'd suggest this cracking pub which is less than 10 minutes' walk from the station.

The other way is Tottenham Hale to Shelford at 40 minutes past the hour, 1 hour 4 minutes journey time. At Shelford 5 minutes walk (0.2 miles) to Woolards Lane, number 7 bus (direction Pampisford) 5 stops 7 minutes to Water Tower, then 15 minute walk (0.7 miles) to the ground.

### Driving

FROM M11 NORTH OR SOUTH OR A505 FROM THE WEST (i.e. ROYSTON)

From Junction 10 of the M11 take the A505 eastbound. At the second roundabout (MacDonalds & BP) turn left on to the A1301 signposted Cambridge, Pampisford and The Shelfords. Do not fork right in to Sawston. Continue on the A1301 past a dual carriageway junction to some traffic lights. Turn right at the traffic lights signposted to Sawston. On entering the village turn left in to Babraham Road at the traffic lights. Grove Road is the sixth road on the left opposite a recreation ground and there is a CCFC badge on a signpost as you turn in. This road bends to the right, then the left when you will see CCFC driveway straight ahead.

For those going via Shelford, I'd suggest this pub in Sawston.

Total journey time from Newbury Park 2 hours 39 minutes. Trains back, with similar shenanigans, depart Felixstowe at 28 minutes past the hour.

Driving seems a sensible option. (details provided by Felixstowe and Walton FC)

The main football club is located at The Martello Ground and is situated in Dellwood Avenue, Felixstowe. The Postcode is IP11 9HT

We are easy to find as there is just the one road into the town.

Take the A14 from Ipswich, over the Orwell Bridge, signposted Felixstowe.

You will reach a set of lights at the 'Dock Spur' roundabout, keep to the left hand lane and cross the roundabout taking the first exit, signposted Town Centre.

At the next roundabout take the first exit. At the next roundabout take the 4th exit onto tree-lined Beatrice Avenue. Dellwood Avenue is the first road on the left.

The Martello Ground is approx. 100 metres on the left, there is limited parking inside the ground but ample on street parking adjacent to the ground in Dellwood Avenue.

## MATCH REPORTS

### Haringey Borough 3-3 Basildon United – Saturday 28th December 2024 Isthmian League North Division

Fans at Coles Park were treated to a post-Christmas cracker of a football match as the points were shared between Haringey Borough and Basildon United in a contest which had everything.

Tom Loizou made one change from the defeat at Walthamstow, with captain Tosin Olufemi coming in for J'Ardell Stirling on the left side of defence. Scott Mitchell partnered Sean Sankanu and Olu Durojaiye in a back 5, with Ebenezer Addo Kuffuor filling in at right wing-back and Jack West Astuti keeping his place between the sticks. The front three remained unchanged with Joe Waight leading the line, Derek Asamoah taking up his usual position on the left wing, and Alfred Bobson Bawling on the right flank. Manny Yeboah and Matty Young started in midfield. Basildon United were playing in their green and white away strip with Boro in the traditional yellow and blue at home.

It was a difficult start to the match for the home side. 12 minutes in, a Scott Mitchell header from an in-swinging Matty Young cross found its way into the back of the net but Mitchell was judged to have been marginally offside, and only two minutes later Boro found themselves behind. Reon Smith-Kouassi, the Basildon number 9, dropped deeper to collect the ball before spraying it out to Billy Willis on the right wing. He controlled the ball before delivering a right-footed cross that was met in the box by Reece Robinson who guided his header down past Astuti into the bottom left corner of the net to give Basildon the lead.

Boro responded well. Bobson Bawling curled a speculative effort just over the top of the cross-bar and Joe Waight volleyed into the side netting coming in at the back post. The pressure eventually told in the 30th minute of the match. After some good play on the left wing, the ball was laid across to the edge of the box where Matty Young was waiting. He arrowed a low left-footed effort towards the goal, which took a slight deflection and nestled into the bottom right corner of the Basildon net to bring Boro level. Buoyed by the goal, Tom Loizou's men began to seize control and won a free kick on the right wing close to the corner flag 35 minutes in. It was a foul but Basildon's Luke Edgar wasn't convinced and was given a yellow card by the referee for dissent. The free kick was swung in by the left foot of Matty Young and was flicked on at the near post by Scott Mitchell, flying past the keeper and into the Basildon goal. There would be no offside flag this time, with Mitchell wheeling away to credit the Boro number 10 for his fine delivery. Just 3 minutes later things got better for Haringey as Basildon seemed to be imploding. Luke Edgar went flying in with a reckless challenge which earned him a second yellow card. What followed has been documented elsewhere; meanwhile on the pitch Boro tried to make the most of their man advantage before half-time, but couldn't extend their lead. Still, they went into the break both a goal and a man-up.

The home team started the second half in much the same way that they finished the first. Bobson Bawling, fired a shot just wide after a smart turn in the box. Joe Waight had a low strike from outside the box that hit the post and came back off the keeper but just stayed out of the net. But 56 minutes in, Basildon United won a free kick just outside the left side of the box. George Scales stepped up and curled a brilliant effort over the Boro wall, off the cross-bar, and past a helpless Jack West-Astuti, who could do nothing about the effort, to bring Basildon level at 2-2 against the run of play. The goal took the sting out of the Boro attack and they struggled to create chances as freely as they had done previously. Joe Waight put an effort into the side netting after an Olufemi shot from outside the box, and Matty Young sent a volley over the bar but Basildon were starting to carry a threat themselves and found their third goal 76 minutes in. Reon Smith-Kouassi again started the move with some good hold-up play on the left wing, before passing to the dangerous George Scales on the edge of the area, who sent a low driven shot into the bottom right corner and past Astuti.

Basildon began to drop deeper with their 10 men and were happy to let Borough have the ball in the hope that they wouldn't find a way past the deep block. For a while, it seemed like their plan would work as Haringey Borough struggled to create any chances of real note. However, in the first minute of stoppage time, substitute Omaru King's outside-of-the-box shot was blocked by the hand of a Basildon Player. The



referee initially gave a free kick but after consulting with the linesman it was correctly changed to a penalty. Matty Young, borough's best player of the afternoon stepped up to take and sent it into the top left corner of the net. The Basildon keeper did get a hand to it but the power on the ball was just enough to creep into the net and earn Boro an equaliser. Young then had a chance to win it in the dying seconds of the match but drilled a left-footed effort just wide of the right-hand post meaning the spoils were shared in a thoroughly entertaining affair.

### **Haringey Borough 2-3 Tilbury – Wednesday 1st January 2025 Isthmian League North Division**

Haringey Borough suffered a narrow New Year's Day defeat to Tilbury at Coles Park despite a couple of wonder goals courtesy of Manny Yeboah and Derek Asamoah.

Tom Loizou made three alterations to the starting eleven that secured a thrilling draw against Basildon United. Cem Poyraz and J'Ardell Stirling returned to the line-up in a back four with Sean Sankanu, and Ebenezer Addo Kufuor, with the ever-present Jack West Astuti retaining his place in goal. Olu Durojaiye captained the side from a deeper-lying midfield position with Matty Young and Manny Yeboah given the freedom to roam ahead of him in the middle of the park. Up front Mekhi McLeod came into the line-up on the left, Alfred Bobson Bawling started on the right flank, and Derek Asamoah started up front wearing the number 9 shirt. Tilbury donned an all-red strip and chose to let the boys in yellow and blue kick towards the car park end in the first half.

Boro fans couldn't have dreamt of a better first 20 minutes of football in 2025. After a couple of half-chances for both teams, the game exploded into life in the 12th minute. Yeboah collected the ball from Bobson Bawling on the left wing just past the half way line. A swift body feint and acceleration saw him breeze past Tilbury's Cameron Brodie and as he moved closer to goal, Tilbury's back line started to retreat. Yeboah glanced up, spotted Tilbury's goalkeeper George Marsh slightly off his line, and seized the opportunity to try his luck from distance. He unleashed a stunning strike with his right boot from around 30 yards out that flew over Marsh, kissed off the post, and went straight into the net to the disbelief of both his team-mates, and all those watching in the stands. Boro almost surrendered their lead immediately, but had West Astuti to thank for denying an unmarked Jack Hayes header from 5 yards out, which came from a recycled free kick. In the 18th minute, Boro miraculously doubled their lead. Mekhi McLeod delivered a corner with his right foot, which was initially flicked sideways by Durojaiye. J'Ardell Stirling then headed it high and forward to the edge of the six-yard box, where Derek Asamoah, closely marked and with his back to goal, was waiting. The 43-year-old rolled back the years, and leaped high in the air to produce an audacious bicycle kick which nestled in the bottom left corner of the net. Whilst the Tilbury players were still appealing for a foul due to a high boot, Asamoah had run off to lap up the adulation of the main stand and was joined by every one of his team-mates, including West Astuti who ran up to join the celebrations.

But as has been the case many times already this season for Boro, the joy didn't last long. Just seven minutes later, Tilbury had halved the deficit. Their big centre half Jordan Clark picked the ball up on the halfway line and fancied his chances to cause some danger. He carried the ball into the Boro half without challenge before laying it to his captain Oliver Spooner on the edge of the penalty area. Clark continued his run into the box and was found with a far too simple one-two which Stirling couldn't cut out, and lifted a smart finish past West Astuti into the roof of the net. The momentum of the game had shifted, and things got worse when the impressive Yeboah had to be replaced by Alkeo Bani in the 29th minute. After Bobson Bawling fired a volley over the bar from a decent Addo Kuffour cross, Tilbury found themselves level just one minute later. A left-footed corner from the right-hand side was swung into the back post and landed at the feet of Cameron Brodie. He lifted the ball back into the six-yard box, where Jordan Clark rose highest to head the ball downwards and through the legs of West Astuti who may be disappointed he couldn't stop the effort. The sides went in level at the break.

The second half was much less frantic than the first. Neither team threatened properly until the 59th minute when Tilbury completed the turnaround. Oliver Spooner chopped inside Addo Kuffour on the left wing and

played a pass infield to the number 9 Alex Hernandez. Hernandez took a clever touch to get around Stirling, before cutting back onto his favoured right foot on the edge of the area. He unleashed a swerving shot, seemingly aided by the windy conditions, that flew towards goal. West Astuti misjudged the trajectory and dived past the ball, which soared high into the centre of the net. Boro only had two real chances from this point forward as Tilbury settled into a more defensive position to protect their three points. Mekhi McLeod whizzed past Alfie Fry near the by-line on the left wing and took his shot from inside the box that was well blocked in a crowded penalty area by a combination of Tilbury defenders. Asamoah also had a good chance blocked from close range in the 80th minute after he had cut onto his right foot in the aftermath of a Boro free kick. As the clock ticked towards 90 Haringey were not able to fashion any opportunities of note. When a chance to put a delivery into the box from a free kick arose, Bani overhit his cross and the ball sailed out for a goal kick, summing up Boro's misfortunes that afternoon.

### **Heybridge Swifts 2 Haringey Borough 2 – Saturday 4th January 2025 Isthmian League North Division**

It's been a few years since Boro faced Heybridge Swifts. Back in 2017/18 season both sides were challenging near the top of Isthmian North and fate conspired to pitch them together 4 times, each match notable or notorious in its own right.

First, Heybridge beating Boro to go through to the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. Then a 0-0 injury time abandonment after a player altercation. In the spring Heybridge recovered from 3 goals and a man down to grab a 3-3 draw and, the denouement to the quartet, a Boro victory in a high stakes play off semi-final. Saturday's return to Heybridge was no less incident packed.

4 goals, 2 penalties a late Red Card and numerous stoppages resulting in the game finishing as time ticked towards 17:15.

Firstly, we wish a speedy recovery to Heybridge keeper Callum Chafer and our own "GFTG" © George Aresti. Both had to leave the field after separate incidents resulting in lengthy stoppages.

On a chilly, overcast, but dry day there was no indication what was to come as both sides eased their way into the game. Heybridge were probing, looking for gaps but Boro were disciplined.

For Boro, Mekhi was providing the chief outlet on the left. Early balls to the flank gave him numerous chances to run at his defender in the first half.

And from one such ball the first lengthy stoppage occurred. Aresti brought the ball away from the edge of the area and looked to sweep a pass Mekhi's way. As he cleared, a challenge came in that caught him slightly late and, off balance, he tumbled awkwardly. It was a full 6 minutes before he was helped off the pitch and away for more treatment to what looks a serious shoulder injury. This resulted in a slight Boro reshuffle with Sean brought on at centre half, with Jorge moving into midfield.

Arguably, the change slightly disrupted Boro as Heybridge scored with their next attack a couple of minutes later. Boro didn't press in midfield, but looked to have good cover as a ball was played into the channel. However, Sean failed to get a good connection to play the ball away leaving Adlington-Pile one on one to sidefoot past Jack.

It was almost 2 soon after. Jack then Tommy making blocks in the 6 yard box to keep the deficit at one as Heybridge controlled possession.

Boro re-settled after this. A good counter was abruptly halted by a sloppy pass, Derek marginally failed to reach a ball ahead of the keeper, and Tommy was then denied from a corner by a fingertip save on to the bar. One final chance in the half saw Mekhi cut in and unleash a shot towards the far post that whistled a yard wide.

It was already 3 minutes into added time when Jorge raced on to a through ball. Heybridge keeper, Chafer, had sensed the danger. As Jorge stretched for the ball Chafer cleared and was caught as he followed through. He was ready to carry on, albeit noticeably limping, 4 minutes later.

The second half took off in much the same fashion but Heybridge soon began to assert a bit more control. Jack saved after a clever free kick routine, had to hack clear from a through ball and then made a third decent

save of the afternoon. Boro's only reply in this passage was a speculative Matt Young effort that went over the bar.

On the hour Alex replaced an out of sorts looking Bobson on the right as Boro got onto a more even keel in the game. Still, the equaliser that arrived on 68 minutes was as out of the blue as it was spectacular. Boro had failed to test Chafer at all since his injury but Matt's dipping, curling effort from 25 yards to the left top corner would've beaten a fully fit keeper. With Boro back in it Cem, who has done a sterling job filling in at full back, made way for Ebz, with Caleb moving across to the left side of the back four.

But, for the second time in the game Boro conceded soon after making a defensive switch. This time a ball into the box saw Tommy and a striker challenge. Tommy would probably say he was trying to ease the attacker under the ball, but he was judged to have barged him over and the referee pointed to the spot. Adlington-Pile made no mistake, sending Jack the wrong way, to grab his second and restore Heybridge's lead.

So, Boro would need to haul themselves level again, and it didn't take them long. Some trickery from Derek by the corner flag created space for a cross that was blocked. He was quickest to the loose ball and as he started towards goal was brought down by a clumsy looking challenge. Penalty to Boro.

Matt stepped up but Chafer guessed correctly and sprung to his right and saved. Fortunately, Olu was johnny-on-the-spot and calmly restored parity from a slight angle as Chafer tried to recover from the initial save.

From now it was anyone's game. Boro had the best chance in the last 10 minutes. Alex, raced onto a through ball and got his shot away with a recovering defender harrying. But Chafer, looking even more uncomfortable after his first half injury, again made a full stretch diving save.

With 4 minutes of normal time remaining there was more encouragement for Boro. Raks finally made his competitive comeback, fully 17 months after his horrific injury at the start of the 2023/24 season. Welcome back Raks!

There was till more incident to come. A long punt upfield from Jack saw Derek wrestle in front of the defender. As the ball travelled towards the area Chafer again anticipated and came out of his area to head clear. In the same instant Derek had started to raise his boot to toe poke the ball. It was difficult to see exactly what happened from behind the goal but Chafer, having ducked his head slightly to clear went down and immediately called for the physio. The assistant referee had the best, side-on, view, and after discussion with the referee Derek was shown a straight red card. Chafer meanwhile was down and treated for nearly 10 minutes, eventually able to groggily stagger off, supported by coaching staff to heartwarming applause.

There was till time for Jack to make one final save before the whistle blew to bring the game to a close.

That's a squad consisting of 13 teenagers and 2 "old ladies" already in their 20s and every one of them gave their all and did themselves and the Club proud – including she who was dismissed but had given the home team plenty of cause for concern in the first half.

As we all realise this season is set to be as disappointing as was 2023/24 with the avoidance of relegation now the sole focus for the First Team. Last season it was the WOMEN who brought a little late cheer by reaching the final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup, again facing a National League side - Ashford Town (Middx) - who we matched until half time when it was two all but they were a little too strong for us after the interval and finished up 4-2 winners. On Sunday 19th January they start this season's campaign in that Competition when London Seaward, another National League side from the Division below Billericay but currently its table footers visit Coles Park. In fact for the last two seasons we have eliminated them from a Cup Competition, albeit by a penalty shoot out after a 2-2 draw on both occasions. The WOMEN are the only one of our 4 teams remaining in a Cup Competition; two in fact for they are also in the Combined Counties League's Women's Invitation Cup. Needless to say we will again be facing National League opponents – most likely Chatham Town currently the leaders of the Division below Billericay (One South East) who must be expected to overcome London Seaward in a delayed tie next week. But why should we think of ourselves as the underdogs after last Wednesday's sparkling display? The game will be on an evening yet to be fixed at Coles Park.

But before those games we have a League fixture at Coles Park tomorrow when bottom team Cambridge

City visit Coles Park and we will be looking to complete the double over them having won the away game 4-0 in September. Supporters who particularly enjoy goal feasts should certainly not miss this match for in the last three games before Billericay we had netted 25 goals. 8 at Coles Park when Bowers & Pitsea visited us followed by another 8 against Leyton Orient in their Brisbane Road Stadium in mid-December and opened the New Year by going one better at Needham Market last Sunday. Goals are always plentiful when we play Needham Market but it is astonishing that when they visited Coles Park in October that match also featured 9 goals with 6 of them being netted by Needham. So what odds would a bookmaker offer for a 0-0 draw with Cambridge tomorrow! It is so frustrating that after our bright start to the season we unexpectedly hit an Autumn slump and even if we now won all 8 remaining League games (which we may well do) and finished with 42 points it is highly unlikely that we would become League Champions as Royston Town already have 30 points with 11 to play and Luton Town 21 points with 14 to play. Nevertheless Bobby, Adem, Karla and Kiki deserve huge credit for the remarkable way in which they brought such an abrupt end to our "nosedive".

## PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

Mildenhall Town were formed 19 years before us in 1898 but 119 years were to pass before there was a game between them and Haringey Borough or any of the former clubs now merged into us. Until 1988 they competed in Leagues centred around Suffolk and Cambridgeshire and acquired Senior status in 1975 when admitted to the Cambridgeshire Premier League. They became founder members of Division One of the Eastern Counties League in 1988 and won promotion to its Premier Division in 1999. They stayed there until 2017 when they spent 2 seasons in the Isthmian Division One North but having finished bottom in both were relegated back to the Eastern Counties Premier Division until being promoted back to the Isthmian North Division as its Champions last season. Today's game will be the third between the Clubs for we played them twice in season 2017/18, winning 2-1 at their Recreation Way ground on September 9th 2017 and 6-0 at Coles Park on 31st March 2018

## OUR RELEGATION DOG FIGHT ANALYSED

At the moment we have amassed 19 points from 25 games which is 0.76 per match. We have 17 games to improve that average and avoid relegation – including today's game, 8 at home and 9 away. In the last 10 completed seasons the team which most narrowly dodged relegation acquired an average points per game of 0.876

The year by year chart below shows that in only one of the 10 seasons covered would we have escaped relegation with a haul of 0.76 per match. The average of 0.876 (which equals 37 points this season) would have sent us down 5 times. The start of the "charge" towards safety cannot be long delayed and garnering all three points today is essential, especially as Mildenhall and all the other endangered Clubs have games in hand on us. To reach even that average we need at least another 18 points from the remaining 17 games so must up our level to 1.059 per match which is almost a 40% increase on our rate so far this season. 5 wins and 5 draws would achieve 37 points but for "insurance" obviously as many more points as possible are desirable.

RYAN COLE used to sneak into Newmarket Town's ground to practice his free-kicks – now the EFL-bound starlet will be trying to break in at Wycombe Wanderers! The 19-year-old midfielder has been snapped up by the League One high-flyers after impressing on a recent trial.

And with Big Ben's New Year chime also signaling the opening of the transfer window for League clubs, you can bet he's not the only one who will be on the move this month.

Gateshead have seen talented midfielder Callum Whelan lured away by Carlisle United – while striker Owen Oseni has been snapped up by SPL outfit St Mirren – and fellow north-east outfit, Spennymoor Town, have seen Isaac Fletcher make the switch to Barrow.

Non-League isn't exactly an untapped resource for talented players but any clubs not operating a strong scouting network throughout the pyramid are certain to be missing out on some gems.

Peterborough United have long been held as the poster club for the model of giving Non-League's finest a chance, but Wycombe are enjoying success of their own.

Top scorer Richard Kone was unearthed at Athletic Newham, Jasper Pattenden one of many success stories from Worthing.

Cole will join the club's development squad initially but his Newmarket Town manager Michael Shinn believes, in time, he can make the grade.

He's certainly a determined and resourceful player. As a youngster, Cole used to jump the fence – and remove panels – to slip inside the Jockeys's ground along with fellow youth product Jacob Mingay.

"It's a funny story – as a kid him and Mingay used to break into the football club," Shinn told The NLP.

"I used to find it quite funny because I'd get a phonecall on a Sunday night, 'Coley's broken into the club, can you speak to him?'

"I'd have to say, 'If you want to go in just ask me and I'll give you the code! Stop breaking into the football club'. "But they'd be in there practicing free-kicks. Last season and this season he's scored so many free-kicks I always made the joke it was worth breaking into the football club and me getting grief because it's turning out alright."

Cole was an important part in the Suffolk club's promotion through the Thurlow Nunn Premier play-offs last season and a key figure in the side playing at Step 4 football for the first time.

Blessed with a gorgeous left foot, Shinn says his ability made it easy to deploy him in a number of roles from left back, wing-back, the No.10, a front two and his natural central midfield position.

"When I first came to the club seven-ish years ago, I had a bit more time on my hands and I used to watch all the EJA (Eastern Junior Alliance) games – U13s, 14s, 15s, 16s – and he was somebody who stood out," Shinn said.

"The further he went on – U15s, U16s – you just knew that when got to 16 you were going to put him in because he can do everything really."

"At 16 he was obviously going to make mistakes but we let him make mistakes and grow. He's got better and better. For large periods of last season he carried us in games. It was no surprise teams eventually would show an interest."

"I am really pleased he's got his opportunity to go to Wycombe and hopefully he can break in there at some point. It won't happen straightaway, I'm sure, but being around it and improving every day, I've got no doubt he can play in the Football League.

"He can defend, he can score goals, he can get out of tight situations, one-v-one he is really good, he's getting stronger and stronger."

## HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



**EBENEZER ADDO KUFOUR** – Ebenezer played over 30 games for us last season mainly occupying the right back position he is versatile and was asked to perform other roles across the defence.

**GEORGIOS ARESTI** – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

**DEREK ASAMOAH** – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal. Since leaving the Boro he has appeared for Cheshunt, Brightlingsea Regent and became the all-time top goal scorer for New Salamis.

**BOBSON BAWLING** – Bobson has had two spells with the Boro, a winger who previously played over 70 games in the football league for Crawley Town, scoring 6 goals.
