## HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

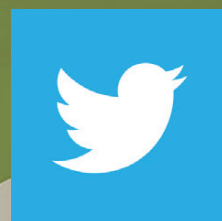

# HISTORY OF IPSWICH WANDERERS FC



**IPSWICH  
WANDERERS**

## **1980**

The Club started as an under 14's boys team in 1980. Two years later they entered the lowest division of the Ipswich Sunday League.

## **1987**

Joined the newly formed Eastern Counties Division One sponsored by Jewsons in 1987 as founder members.

## **1994**

Home games were played at our present ground at Humber Doucy Lane, under the name of Loadwell Ipswich. Jimmy Barker became a very influential chairman and he negotiated a name change to Lancaster Ipswich FC before we eventually became Ipswich Wanderers. Jimmy died in November 1994 and his presence is sadly missed. Thankfully after all his work he saw the floodlights switched on in September 1994 in a match against Ipswich Town.

## **1996-97**

Great ground improvements were made in the early years under the direction of Development Officer Roger Woshalo and ground Manager Tim Davey.

## **2005-06**

A losing Suffolk Senior Cup appearance in 1996/97 led to the following season becoming Champions of Division One, under the Chairmanship of Alan Haste, nine points clear of Maldon Town and losing only three league matches all season. Reaping the rewards of a successful youth policy which saw numerous trophies filling the clubhouse cabinet, a well organised side with a good balance between youth and experience saw us establish ourselves as a Premier Division side for a number of seasons until we suffered relegation on the last day of the 2002/3 season at Wisbech.

## **2006-07**

The following season saw Jason Dozzell join the Club as Manager and after a midtable finish in his first campaign, the second season saw the Club sweep to the 1st Division title and with the assistance of Kevin Cunningham and Glynn Hague, the team finished 7th in the Premier Division in 2005/6, with the League's second best defence with home crowds on average exceeding 100.

## **2007-08**

At the end of the 2005/6 Jason Dozzell and Chairman David Bugg left. Local businessman Ed Nicholls became Chairman and John Clarkson was appointed Manager having arrived with a reputation from the West Country. During the season he guided the club to the final of the Ridgeons League Cup, the 5th round of the FA Vase and a Suffolk Premier Cup Semi Final against Ipswich Town.

At the end of the campaign John left the Club and with an exodus of players, the Club appointed ex player Louis Newman to the role, Louis built a young, inexperienced squad and after a poor start to the campaign which included some record defeats, was replaced by another former player Steve Buckle who was brought in to rebuild the squad and hopefully retain the Club's premier status. Unfortunately Steve was unable to prevent relegation and the only positive from the season was the Reserves capture of the Chell Trophy defeating Wroxham.

## **2011-12**

Despite Steve's best efforts over the following few seasons the Club failed to build a promotion push throughout the campaigns and after a poor start to the 2011/12 season, Steve and Assistant Paul Grainger parted company with the Club. New chairman Terry Fenwick appointed Glenn Read and he brought in his own players and former Stowmarket Town boss Steve Jay as his assistant. He quickly revamped the squad and had the Club climbing the table before the end of the season.

## **2012-13**

The 2012/3 season saw the Club just fail to clinch promotion to the Premier Division and lose on penalties in the semi final in the First Division Cup. The season did finish on a high as the Club clinched its first ever Suffolk Senior Cup trophy defeating local rivals Whitton United in the final. It was a remarkable victory

coming from a goal down in normal time and then from 3-0 down in the penalty shoot out.

#### **2013-14**

2013/14 saw promotion achieved with two long unbeaten runs ensuring a return to the Premier Division, we also lost a tight Senior Cup final against Whitton United and set a new club record with a 12-1 win over Downham Town.

#### **2014-15**

The 2014/15 was mixed as we adapted to Premier Division and finished 9th and enjoyed a good run in the FA Vase but off field the club lost one of its driving forces Roger Wosahlo mid-season.

#### **2015-16**

In 2015-16 we defeated Canvey Island in the FA Cup and enjoy our best ever FA Vase run but with a heavy fixture backlog, relegation fears were only ended just before the season end. Glenn stepped down at the end of the season and for 2016-17 the Club appointed Shane Wardley as Player/Manager.

#### **2017-18**

Shane's first season saw us almost emulate our highest ever position, however, after a poor start to the 2017-18 season Shane resigned and following a disastrous spell under Mark Benterman, club legend Mark Goldfinch took over the side ably assisted by James Buckle and Daniel Thrower. Unfortunately, relegation could not be avoided and in 2018-19 we consolidated and lost in the Senior Cup Semi Final to Cornard.

#### **2019-20**

In 2019-20 with Stephen Boyle taking over as Chairman, we rebuilt and after a sticky spell in October we were closing in on the promotion pack and reached a Semi Final of the Suffolk Senior Cup before the season came to an abrupt end. With further additions on field and some good improvements off field under Stephen's leadership, we then looked to gain the vital promotion required for us to take the next steps forward with a good squad. The start to the next season was positive and a second Senior Cup trophy was clinched in the delayed final with a single strike from Connor Field clinching the trophy.

#### **2021/22**

After a couple of Covid-19 disrupted and curtailed seasons, for the 2021/22 season Wanderers went into action in the Thurlow Nunn First Division South. With what became a tight run affair and particular rivalry with Buckhurst Hill also aiming for the title, it went almost to the wire, Wanderers finally having the upper hand, and lifting the trophy with a goal 10 seconds from time in the final home game. With the final of the Suffolk Senior Cup to follow, we finished the season with 26 straight wins, and a well deserved double of league and cup was won!

#### **2022-23**

The following season started with four cup fixtures in the opening 7 games, and a haul of just 3 points from the first 5 league games meant Wanderers were already playing catch up when our league campaign really got going. A run of 6 wins in an 8 game unbeaten run helped to move us up the table before another rare defeat. More wins followed until in January, we visited top of the table Thetford, which ended in a 1-2 defeat. After this, Wanderers embarked on another 17-game winning run to the end of the season, including coming from behind to avenge the result against Thetford, going above them and ultimately become Thurlow Nunn Premier winners - back to back champions - and into Step 4 football for the first time in the club's history.

#### **2023-24**

The 2023/24 season, the first for the club in the Isthmian League North came with added pressure - both on and off the pitch. A poor start to the season on the pitch brought a change in September, with the departure of Mark Goldfinch & James Buckle. Glen Driver came in as manager, with the task of keeping the club clear of relegation. Off the pitch was a mammoth job with a huge amount of work needed to pass the ground grading requirements to stay at this level. The inspection in April brought a great deal of relief, and along with the efforts of Glen and his team on the pitch, meant the aims for the season were achieved.

Now to move forwards into 2024/25 and properly compete...

I thought we played well and with confidence, we certainly didn't deserve to go behind but we did however, the spirit shown to get back into the game was excellent. Please don't tut just allow us a few small pleasures, they've been in short supply this season. We have also re-signed goalkeeper Remy Mitchell, who was here earlier in the season, again to cover for Jack whilst injured. Another signing is a winger, David Mata, who last played abroad in Portugal for CD Feirense.

Leaving us sadly is Ebenezer Addo, which means no more Agadoo as he won't be wearing yellow and blue or being our number two. Kaylen Hinds who was on loan, but not for long, has returned to Hemel Hempstead. Omaru King who made a couple of substitute appearances has joined Lewes. We have lost a King but a Prince remains, who incidentally did very well at Maldon with his tireless running upfront.

In the last programme I mentioned that work was being undertaken to extend the away dressing room, this work is complete and has been confirmed by the Football Foundation as meeting the required dressing room

size for our ground grading. This means all of the points raised for us to resolve have been completed. We now just await formal confirmation.

Our next game after today is Saturday 22nd away at high flying Brentwood Town, they possess a few players that have worn the yellow and blue, Ade Cole, Tayler Curren and Lyle Della Verde. The next home game is against Gorleston on the 1st March I don't really want to have to recall the away game but if we need any incentive thoughts of the 7-0 loss should be enough to mean we seek an element of pride and revenge.

There is one fixture change to make you aware of our away game against Concord Rangers has been brought forward from Easter Saturday to Good Friday 18th April, still with a 3pm kick off.

Our average attendance has picked up given Saturday afternoon games have replaced the run of midweek games we had in the autumn, the support at Coles Park has been great and the team rewarded us with 3 points, let's ensure we get behind the team once again and let's continue this run we are on. Come on Boro!!

## LAST WEEKEND IN RETROSPECT

### WE EXIT THE DROP ZONE

Saturday's trip to Maldon & Tiptree's Park Drive Stadium where we had lost on 6 of our 7 previous visits was not really something a team fighting relegation would have chosen or welcomed. As has so often been our problem in the last two seasons we conceded an early goal but this time shrugged off the setback and were 2-1 ahead at the interval thanks to a penalty following a hand ball as a corner came over, confidently arrowed home by Matt Young and an own goal, which might have gone in anyway when Derek Asamoah raced in from the left and drove the ball across almost from the bye-line. In between the goals a broken nose for Tommy Boxer saw long term injury returner Rakim Richards brought on for what was to be his longest spell in a match since his recent return to the squad. Rakim had taken part in our only previous victory, and had scored the second goal in our 2-1 win, at Park Drive way back on 8th December 2015 and Jorge Djassi Sambu also played in both matches. All 5 of our following visits have ended in defeat. The second half was an even affair in which we spurned two glorious chances to extend our lead. Maldon never gave our debut making 'keeper, Ashlee Jones signed yesterday from Saffron Walden Town, the opportunity to deliver anything spectacular but he did everything required of him efficiently and spread confidence to those in front of him and his long kicks set many attacks in motion. Naturally Maldon pounded away at us in the nail biting 5 minutes of added time which has so often been our Achilles heel. But not on this occasion as everyone did their utmost to keep them out and deservedly succeeded. A great day was made better by other results going our way as all of the other bottom six teams lost which enabled us to lift ourselves into that precious 18th spot and on the evidence of our recent improved performances we must now have a real chance of holding on to it even though all our rivals have two or more games in hand on us. Really all our games are now "must wins" or at the very least "must not losers" and none more so than against today's visitors who currently foot the table. (midweek update – there was an unwelcome result on Tuesday as the team in 17th place won and are now 4 points ahead of us with a game in hand (Newmarket Town won 1-0 at Mildenhall Town)..... the UNDER 23s had got the weekend off to a reasonable start with a 2-2 draw when Walthamstow Reserves visited Coles Park on Friday evening.....on Sunday the WOMEN replayed their voided Capital Womens Senior Cup game with London Seaward at Coles Park and sent their National League opponents away as 3-0 losers. The opening exchanges were quite even but midway through the half a penalty awarded during a goalmouth scramble caused by a corner kick enabled Ronnell Humes to find the net with a drive low into the 'keepers right hand corner. Just a few minutes into the second half Ronnell doubled the lead as she closed in on a cross from the left and blasted the ball into the roof of the net from what looked like an impossible angle. Ten minutes later Borough 'keeper Emma Roberts pulled off a magnificent diving save of a swerving long shot which would surely have encouraged the visitors to pile on the pressure. But the Borough defence was in fine form and denied the visitors any clear cut chances. ## MATCH REPORT

### Haringey Borough 2-1 Grays Athletic – Saturday 1st February 2025 Isthmian League North Division

Haringey Borough won a vital three points in the dying seconds of their match against Grays Athletic to boost their survival hopes in the Isthmian League North Division.

Tom Loizou's men were coming off the back of an impressive 0-0 draw against league leaders Felixstowe & Walton United, and as a result, only one change was made to the line-up with Derek Asamoah returning after suspension. Jack West Astuti started in Goal behind a back four of Captain Tosin Olufemi, Scott Mitchell, Tommy Boxer, and Michael O'Donoghue. The Midfield consisted of Olu Durojaiye, Ryan Havel, and the inventive Matty Young slightly ahead. Cem Poyraz started on the left wing and Jorge Djassi-Sambu retained his place up front with the number 9 shirt.

The first half was cagey with neither team willing to give the opposition space but the first big chance of the game fell to the opposition. From a Haringey Borough corner, Grays Athletics' Qoda Gordan cleared the ball up to the halfway line. Shane Temple flicked the ball around Michael O'Donoghue and was suddenly bearing down on the Boro Goal. From just outside the box he tried to curl the ball into the bottom right corner but West Astuti got down quickly to turn the ball away. The only real chance from Boro in the first half came from the creativity of Derek Asamoah who spun the opposition full-back inside out before accelerating into the box and firing a shot into the near side netting.

The boys in yellow and blue started the second half brightly. In the 50th minute, Matty Young curled a left-footed free-kick over the wall that was heading straight for the bottom corner but was well saved by the opposition goalkeeper. From the resulting corner, Matty Young played a one-two with Asamoah before whipping in a delivery to the back post where Jorge Djassi Sambu was waiting but headed wide. But just two minutes later, Boro found themselves behind. Louie Remi took up the ball on the left wing and carried it infield, Shane Temple made the over-lapping run inside Tosin Olufemi and Remi laid the ball off to him. Temple skipped past Tommy Boxer who was cautious not to give away a penalty and pulled the ball back from the by-line to the centre of the penalty area, where Samir Ali slid in to apply a scruffy finish and give Grays Athletic the lead.

But spurred on by the 300 faithful in Cole's Park Boro wouldn't be beaten without a fight. Derek Asamoah managed to keep Matty Young's switch of play in bounds, before skilfully creating an angle for a shot which he aimed to curl the ball towards the bottom right corner. Although the Grays' goalkeeper parried it into a dangerous area, no Boro player was on hand to capitalise on the rebound. West Astuti did have to make another decent stop shortly after from Shane Temple but it was Boro who were firmly in control and applying pressure. First, Olufemi whipped a dangerous low cross across the goal, but no yellow shirt was there to meet it. Then, Ryan Havel controlled Boxer's switch of play on the left wing and cut the ball back to Asamoah, who repeated his earlier trick to create space and shoot from the left-hand side of the box. This time the shot was deflected but Sambridge was alert, and his quick reactions saw the ball behind for a corner at the near post. But from an almost identical pattern of play, Boro found the equaliser in the 65th minute. Asamoah's tricky feet were causing all sorts of problems down the left wing. His step-over fooled the opposing defence and he again tried to curl a shot into the bottom right corner but this time it was blocked by a sliding defender. The ricochet came out to Ryan Havel whose tame effort was parried away by Sambridge. Thankfully this time it fell to a player in a yellow shirt on the right-hand side of the box. Matty Young took one touch to control the ball and struck it low firmly with his laces and it flew into the net at the near post to give Boro the lead at the third time of asking. Grays Athletic were still a threat, and Tommy Boxer, who played brilliantly on the day, did well to intercept a dangerous low cross in his own box. Boro lost some momentum after their equaliser but as the game lulled and seemed to be heading for a draw, Cem Poyraz was Brought down inside the box by Quba Gordon giving Boro the perfect opportunity to steal the three points at the end of the match. Captain Olufemi took responsibility on his own shoulders and slotted the penalty straight down the middle as Sambridge dived to the left to start joyous celebrations from the players at Cole's Park, with high fives being given out to the crowd as well. Boro survived the little pressure that Grays could create in the final few minutes of stoppage time to secure a vital three points and give them hope of surviving this season.

## PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

Ipswich Wanderers are one of the "youngest" teams in the Isthmian League having been founded as an Under 14 Boys Club in 1980 and moving into Sunday football playing under the name of Loadwell Ipswich until securing admission to the Eastern Counties League Division One and changing their name to Ipswich Wanderers in season 1989/90. For the next 34 seasons they remained in that League with spells in both its Premier Division and Division One. Having been Premier Division Champions in 2022/23 they were promoted to the Isthmian North Division and finished in 17th place last season. Currently they foot the table so like us are desperate to preserve their Step 4 status making todays match a "must win" game (or at the very least a "must not lose" encounter. We have visited their Humber Doucy Sports Centre Ground twice. Last season we met in the League Cup on 31st October and were 4-2 winners. # THE NON-LEAGUE PAPER

IN last Sunday's NLP, we spoke exclusively to National League CEO Mark Ives to look deeper into the national 3UP campaign, officially calling for a third promotion spot into the EFL.

Backed by all 72 member clubs at Step 1 and 2 after years of planning, the proposal officially calls for a change in regulations from the current two-up system and has received widespread support from the Non-League game.

But, as we've also heard this week, the campaign has also come up against some fierce opposition and there is a lot of convincing left needed to be done if EFL clubs are to vote in favour of the proposal at the EFL's AGM this June..

Ives spoke passionately the logistics behind the campaign but also warned that unless the matter is addressed now, it risks being kicked down the road for more years to come.

"Why now is a really important question," he told The NLP. "Everybody is aware we've been having conversations privately with the EFL. They've been very constructive, very amiable conversations.

"Then we have the Independent Football Regulator coming in. Whilst there are debates ongoing at the minute between the parliamentary houses and, potentially, up to 400 suggested amendments to the Bill that are being discussed, what is sure is the regulator is coming into play.

"That brings in another dynamic from an EFL point of view because the EFL are saying while they're supportive in principle of this issue, they cannot take this forward until the other footballing matters are dealt with – the current discussions between the PL and the EFL over the wider distribution of monies. That's a matter for the PL and the EFL, that's not a matter for us.

"We do not see them as being interdependent to the issue of three-up. If you think about them not being able to deal with anything until the matter is resolved between the PL and the EFL, which would potentially mean the regulator, the backstop and everything else kicking into play."

The National League's plea came after a wide-ranging BBC Sport interview with EFL chairman Rick Parry back in November when he accepted the need for change, commenting: "we have to acknowledge the need to look downwards as well as upwards".

But as columnist Chris Dunlavy warned in our sister paper, The Football League Paper, last Sunday, finding support from EFL clubs will be far from easy.

"It's only natural to ask why turkeys would vote for Christmas, and in the short-term it's a logical argument. Nobody wants to make themselves more vulnerable to relegation," Dunlavy writes.

"So precarious are finances throughout the EFL, however, that all but the biggest clubs could become a basket case, practically overnight. Remember Bolton, or Derby?"

"There's also a lot of money in Non-League, meaning the clubs who come up - like Stockport and Wrexham - tend to push the incumbents down.

That makes relegation at least a reasonable possibility for the majority of EFL clubs and means three-up, three-down is very much in their long-term interest.

"Unfortunately, that's not how people operate. Which is why, without legislative intervention or a financial sweetener, the National League's 3UP campaign is a non-starter."

Shrewsbury Town manager Gareth Ainsworth agrees.

Speaking on BBC Radio 5 Live Sport's 72+ EFL podcast last week, the former Wycombe Wanderers gave a rather damning indictment of the proposal, while voicing his annoyance at being unable to compete

financially with wealthy clubs coming from Non-League such as Wrexham, Notts County and Chesterfield. Ainsworth said: "Obviously, we're not going vote for it. Who in the right mind in the EFL will be the vote for, you know, three down, three up?"

"But that National League, believe me, very strong. And often the team that do come up. They compete well.

"And I think that's a big argument point for them saying, look at your records, look at your Chesterfields of yours, look at your, you know, Stockports, you know.

"They've all kicked on, but it could kill some really, really big league teams. You know, you Oldhams and your Torquays. They've really found it difficult getting back in.

"Should we not look after our teams that you know, we keep going on about the teams that are struggling. We should look after our pyramid better.

"And the teams if a team just can't keep up financially, but no other reason than the other teams have got billionaires coming in a million is that we it's not fair that they just sink out the league and out of obscurity.

"So my argument would be, yes. These teams have done well, but have a look at the money that they've had invested in them as well."

## HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



**GEORGIOS ARESTI** – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

**DEREK ASAMOAH** – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United.
