HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

HISTORY OF CAMBRIDGE CITY FC



Early years

The club was formed in 1908 as Cambridge Town, the direct descendant of the earlier Cambridge St Mary's club which had folded at the end of the 1907-1908 season following a dispute with the local Cambs FA. As a torchbearer for amateur football in the days when many clubs viewed the professional game with disdain, the new club affiliated itself with the recently established Amateur Football Association rather than the Cambridge Town amalgamated with an earlier Cambridge United club in May 1914, joined the Cambs FA, and in turn gained entry into the FA Cup and the FA Amateur Cup for the first time, whilst retaining their AFA links. The club's best ever run in the Amateur Cup came in 1928 when they reached the semi Final only to lose to Leyton at Fulham's Craven Cottage ground. Town had successes in the Southern Amateur League, winning the title five times between 1920 and 1931. The club joined the Spartan League in 1935, winning the Premier Division in 1948 & 1949 before stepping up to the Athenian League in 1950. Cambridge was granted City status in 1951 and with it the club's name change to Cambridge City

Southern League Champions

City left the amateur game in 1958 and joined the Southern League, gaining a place in the Premier Division of the Southern League at the first attempt. City won the Premier Division in 1962/63, edging out local rivals Cambridge United in an enthralling title race with the local derby at Milton Road being witnessed by over 11,500 people. City were regular challengers for the title and had the highest attendances in non-league football up until the mid-1960s. But City lost their way and were relegated to Southern League Division 1 in 1968. Promotion back to the Premier Division followed in 1970, the same year that Cambridge United were elected to the Football League.

Strife in the 1970s

City finished Southern League runners up in 1970/71, but the latter years of the decade were a real struggle. Relegation in 1975/76 saw crowds dwindle and the Club fall into decline. In 1977, Directors decided that the club should join the Isthmian League. At the time this was seen as a backward step by many supporters. With scenes that would be repeated 30 years later, a subsequent fans' protest forced most of the Board to resign. The club thus remained in the Southern League.

Better times

After the redevelopment of the ground in the mid 1980's, City gradually improved and a new generation of fans mobbed their heroes after the 1985/86 Southern League Southern Division championship was won on the last day of the season. The goal scoring exploits of Gary Grogan were instrumental in City's recovery, according him a 'City Legend' status. Since the turn of this century, City have reached the 1st round proper of the FA Cup four times and the 2nd round once, a record far better than achieved by the more illustrious City sides of the 1960s.

Ups and downs

Recent seasons have been a roller-coaster ride for the City faithful. City's best season for 30 years saw them finish runners up in the inaugural Conference South season in 2004/05, going on to lose in the play-offs. Off the field the ground had been sold to pay off mounting debts and matters took a turn for the worse in 2006 when the then Board announced an agreement to allow City to be absorbed into Cambridge United. With City on the brink of extinction, supporters were galvanised into a campaign which eventually forced Directors to resign, to be replaced by members of the Cambridge City Supporters' Trust. The opening league match of 2006/07 was arguably the most memorable since the early 1960s – not merely because City won with a stoppage time winner at Havant & Waterlooville, but because it offered irrefutable proof that that City had survived a blatant attempt to kill it off and were very much alive and kicking. City celebrated their centenary in 2008, but were demoted at the end the 2007/08 season due to over-zealously applied ground regulations. This decision ended 22 consecutive seasons in the 2nd tier of non-league football. City lost out to Gloucester City in the 2008/09 play-off. In the 2009/10 season, City won the Southern League Cup for

the first time and finished one point shy of a playoff place. With the ground sold, a groundshare agreement was in place with Newmarket Town for the 2010/11 season but a last minute offer from the landlord meant that City had another season in its own stadium and celebrated by securing a place in the playoffs with a 4th place finish in the league. However, this was met with disappointment again as the team lost at Salisbury City. Another reprieve following a new deal with the landlord gave City two more seasons at Milton Road, 2011/12 and 2012/13. Once again the play-offs were reached but again an away defeat in the semi final, this time at Oxford City. This disappointment was however tempered by the news that the club has secured a site on which to build a new stadium and training complex. City ultimately missed out on a play-off spot in the 2012/13 season, but the club enjoyed a FA Cup run, with a televised first round proper home tie with MK Dons producing a fantastic night with a nil nil draw at Milton Road before losing in the replay at Stadium MK. With our lease on the stadium finally coming to an end, April 27th 2013 saw the last ever first team match at the ground before a large crowd with mixture of tears and smiles. Adrian Cambridge had the honour of scoring the last ever goal at Milton Road in the one nil victory over Redditch United.

New era

A new era for the club commenced in August 2013 starting with a ground-share at Histon FC. City once again reached the play-offs that season but once again tasted semi final defeat, this time at home to St Albans City. The 2015-16 season saw City move to share at St Ives Town FC. Manager Gary Roberts left in the summer of 2016 after 13 years at the club. His replacement Dan Gleeson had a short and ultimately unsuccessful spell in charge, former player Robbie Nightingale taking over as manager in December 2016. Robbie won his first game in charge to boost City's hopes of avoiding the drop. City's playing record improved culminating in five wins and a draw in their last six games but ultimately it was not enough and the club were relegated to step four for the first time in our history. Hopes of bouncing straight back were dashed when we lost in the play-off to Hartley Wintney.

City returned to Histon FC for the 2018-19 season and in the summer of 2019 were moved laterally to The Isthmian League. City's debut season in the league seemed on course for an exciting conclusion with the club on an unbeaten 7 game run in February & March, with no goals conceded, and the play-offs were in sight. However, as we all know the global pandemic saw the season declared null and void as was the 2020-21 season. Another league switch occurred in the summer of 2021, City being placed in the Northern Premier League.

Continued delays with City's new stadium have meant a continuation of ground share arrangements, returning to Westwood Road in St Ives for the 2023-24 season. City ended last season just above the relegation zone, the 17th place finish the lowest the club has ever sat in the current pyramid structure.

As the club awaits for the new ground to finally open this season we continue to play at St Ives Town FC. Robbie Nightingale signed off his nearly eight years in charge by winning the Cambs Invitation Cup for the first time since 2017. Jamie Cureton was appointed as the new manager in May 2024 as City were moved from the Northern Premier League to the Isthmian League for this season.

On Saturday 30th November 2024 City finally played a first team fixture in their new stadium against Tilbury FC in The PitchingIn Isthmian League North Division.

2 games, 2 points, 2 sending offs and 2 two missed opportunities. In the last 2 weeks we have had the chance to pull clear of the relegation zone but at the same time we could have been close to the abyss, as it is we find ourselves still in with a chance, still in a fight. It was said last Saturday it is now out of our hands, which got me thinking what a crazy thing to say, let's be sensible if we win all our games we will stay up, others around us won't do the same and for us to have any chance, we need to stop pressing the self-destruct button. We did appeal unsuccessfully for Sydney's sending off against Witham Town to be overturned, so he will miss two more games and today we are missing MoD for last week's sending off. We have also been charged by the FA for accumulating 6 bookings and a red card in the Witham game, so it has been an expensive time for the club. John Bacon has a philosophy of not commenting on the officials performance and this has been passed down to me.

Looking at Saturday's game first, if you were offered being two up after seventeen minutes against the team just above you in the table and the opportunity to leapfrog them, you'd take it every day of the week, as it was there was an element of relief at the final whistle that we had come away with a point. When Derek had converted the rebound off the post from Matt Young's shot and then Jorge had lobbed the keeper to make it 2, it was pinch me I'm dreaming stuff. For most of the remainder of the game however, it was hiding behind the sofa stuff. The football cliché, a goal just before half time is the worst time to concede came into play and despite making it to the last ten minutes in the lead, we didn't look confident or comfortable that we were going to hold out. As it was it ended 2-2 and with all of the teams around us losing, we move on to today. A couple of observations from last week's game, Ashlee in goal knows how to command his penalty area, it was Val-esque, high praise indeed, to see him coming out and claiming everything in the air, it must give those players around him confidence that he going to claim everything, he's clearly an experienced goalkeeper when you see the clubs he has played for and it shows. It was also noticeable how terrifying it must be to be up against Jorge, in the first half he was a real handful and the defenders didn't know how to handle him, his ability to hold the ball up or flick it on was impressive given he has played mostly as a central midfielder or centre half when needed. Also a few people have asked about Jack West-Astuti, our goalkeeper, Jack was injured and as he was on a dual registration with Averley he returned to them, he has now subsequently joined Dartford. A popular figure in the short time he was with us we wish him well for the future.

On Sunday there was a fantastic occasion at Coles Park with the Women's team taking on Arsenal's U21 team, whilst the result didn't go our way losing 5-1, it was lovely to see so many people coming down to support, in what was a record crowd for a home game for the team, the atmosphere was superb and the joy that greeted the goal that meant we went 1-0 up was amazing. The club can be immensely proud of itself in its hosting the game and producing such a great occasion against such illustrious opposition.

I also want to highlight the fantastic work that Emma O'Donoghue has done with help from Chloe, introducing the Junior Boro initiative, the excited kids that are now buzzing around waiting for half time, waiting to attempt to score past Trevor, our goalkeeping coach, is great, I understand Trevor has become a bit of a pantomime villain and you have to earn the right to score past him rather than it being expected. I hope kids up and down Haringey are practising in anticipation for their opportunity on a Saturday to score past Trevor, also great to have Lawrence on the tannoy call the names out of those taking part. Well done all, fantastic initiative.

Back to today, hopefully I have not added to the nerves by reiterating the importance of the game, let's allow ourselves to be free of burden and get behind the team and get the result we need. Come on Boro!!

PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

Although they are just one year younger than us having come into existence as Cambridge Town in 1908 the League meeting earlier this season was the first ever between Cambridge City and Haringey Borough won 2-1 by City on January 18th as we have never been drawn together in any of the FA National Competitions. It was not until 1951 when Cambridge was granted City status that the "Town" was changed to "City". In their early years the Club was staunchly amateur and chose membership of the AFA rather than a Football Association affiliated County and were members of the Southern Amateur League from 1913 to 1935, during which time Ipswich Town were similarly an AFA Club and were their great rivals. But for season 1935/36 they switched to the Spartan League and remained in it until 1950 (apart from the War Years interruption) before leaving to join the then more prestigious Athenian League for 7 years starting in 1950/51. During those Spartan years there will have been meetings with the Wood Green Town arm of our Club as they were also Spartans during that period. City then switched to the semi-professional Southern League in 1958/59 and remained in it up to and including 2018/19 apart from a 4 year spell in the National League starting in 2004. They spent the 2 Covid years as Isthmians but were somewhat surprisingly bounced by the FA into the Northern Premier League and spent 3 years therein until being switched back to the Isthmian North Division for the current season. Although there has been only one game between the Club's Mens team there have been a dozen or so meetings between our respective Womens teams since Borough Women joined the Eastern Region Womens League in 2000 in League games when both Clubs have been in the same Division including the current season in which we have achieved 6-0 home and 4-0 away wins. The League Cup has also paired us together on 3 occasions most notably in 2016/17 when we won the Final by 5-1 but City have had their years of superiority too and overall the record is very even.

TIME flies when you're having fun and that's certainly the case here at The NLP.

On Wednesday, March 26 we celebrated our 25th anniversary since the paper hit the newsstands.

In the years since, we've been lucky enough to have a front row seat to the heartbeat of English football.

We've seen an increased profile of this level of the game, a jump in professionalism, more than one restructure of the Pyramid and written about countless teams, players, managers, clubs, grounds – and results!

Stuart Pearce implored top clubs to unearth Non-League treasures on the front cover of The NLP's first ever edition – and what good advice it has proved!

The England legend famously took that path himself, beginning at Wealdstone before going onto have a decorated career at the very top of the English game.

Pearce joined the Essex Senior League's Non-League Day groundhop last weekend to see the impact of the Premier League's Stadium Fund, which has distributed more than £207 million in grants to over 1,000 men's and women's clubs throughout the English Football League, National League and football pyramid.

The fund, like The NLP, is celebrating its 25th anniversary and Pearce smiled when looking back at issue one of The Non-League Paper.

"It's incredible – and 25 years later Dan Burn walks out in an England shirt," Pearce told The NLP. "That's a great point in case. A lot of players get released from academies and it can diminish their spirit but it shouldn't necessarily do that.

"In fact – and I got released from QPR as a 13-year-old – it should inspire you to prove people wrong.

"I think all of football was delighted to see Dan Burn arrive in an England shirt. For what he's doing for his club, a hometown boy if you like, and his pathway, it sends a great message out to youngsters that you don't have to be a superstar to start with. If you're determined, dogged, then you've got every opportunity."

Kevin Ellison was on target the weekend The Non-League Paper was launched...and he's still doing the business for Step 4 Vauxhall Motors now at the age of 46!

The then-winger was on target for the Robins in a 1-1 draw with Kettering Town, one of the final points they picked up that season.

Ellison excelled, earning a move to Premier League Leicester City a year later, but a late slump saw Alty relegated after a season back in the Nationwide Conference.

"I'd have rather not had a good season and we stayed up," Ellison told The NLP.

"Getting back into the English pyramid was a big thing for me then, I'd been playing in the League of Wales.

"Altrincham gave me that great opportunity to go pro. I owe them a lot. You dream of it as a little boy.

"It didn't happen for me when I was younger because clubs were telling me I wasn't good enough, then five or six years ago they were bidding for me when they could have had me for free!"

Ellison recalls how keeping track of his career was a bit different at the turn of the century.

"I used to get the Manchester Pink and the Liverpool Echo, my regional North West papers," he said. "My mum used to cut out write-ups on me.

"It was probably harder then for your ability to get recognised.

"Look at how many lads are uploading YouTube clips now? We didn't have that then, but that's not a negative.

"I'm fortunate to have played in old school football and the fast paced tempo game now.

"People will say the game was a bit slower then but it felt like it was more 'proper' football.

"Has the game changed for the better? Who knows.

"You should never forget your roots, even when I was in League Two I was still picking up my copy of The Non-League Paper."

Thanks Kev and to everyone else who has supported us through the years. Here's to the next 25 years!

HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



GEORGIOS ARESTI – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal. Since leaving the Boro he has appeared for Cheshunt, Brightlingsea Regent and became the all-time top goal scorer for New Salamis.

BOBSON BAWLING – Bobson has had two spells with the Boro, a winger who previously played over 70 games in the football league for Crawley Town, scoring 6 goals. Other clubs Bobson has played for include Woking, Torquay United, Oxford City, St Albans City, Enfield Town, and Hendon. Known for his versatility, Bobson can play in various midfield positions and has also been deployed as a right-back.

TOMMY BOXER – An experienced centre back, Tommy was player-manager at New Salamis during the 2023/2024 season.

WILLIAM DANQUAH – A left back who is signed on a dual registration with FC Romania, William has appeared for the Boro previously where he made a handful of appearances, nearly ten years ago.

JORGE DJASSI SAMBU – A huge influence on the team's success in recent years, Jorge is a centre midfielder that loves to tackle and is a commanding figure in the centre of the pitch. He has now been with the club for over 10 seasons but will always be held in the highest regard for his 2 goals in the play-off semi-final of 2018.

OLU DUROJAIYE – A player well known to Boro fans having had several spells with the club, the first dates back to the 2015/2016 season. A midfield player Olu started his football journey with Tottenham Hotspur before playing in Scotland and then for a number of National South clubs.

RALSTON GABRIEL – A prolific striker, Ralson has rejoined The Boro after previous spells at the club, also appeared for St. Albans and Borehamwood, Ralston will always be remembered for his goals during the promotion season of 2017/2018.

RYAN HERVEL – Ryan, a midfielder, joins from Potters Bar Town having previously been with the Boro during the 2017/2018 season.
