HARINGEY BOROUGH FC - A BRIEF HISTORY

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.



The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current Manager – the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon & Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper

where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix, thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger. 2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable

success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in 2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome. Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

The Directors and Committee of *HARINGEY BOROUGH FOOTBALL CLUB* take pleasure in extending a warm welcome to all visitors to Coles Park and hope that they will make use of the bar and refreshment facilities available to increase their enjoyment of the occasion.

PAST ENCOUNTERS WITH TODAY'S VISITORS

Although 27 years older than Borough, having been formed as Heybridge FC in 1880 and adding "Swifts" to their name 100 years later, it was not until season 1984/85 when both Clubs became members of the Isthmian League Division 2 North that the first meeting took place. Unsurprisingly really, as Heybridge had up to then played exclusively in Leagues with membership restricted to East Anglian Clubs. 17 first team games have since ensued of which Borough have won 8, Swifts 6 and drawn 3. Season 2017/18 was a never to be forgotten season in our "history" with the Swifts as we met on 4 occasions – those shown in the chart below in bold italics. There is a superb article penned by Nick in the next pages of the programme and everyone is urged to read it for it is a blow by blow account in great detail which shows just how vital those meetings were for both Clubs. Our loss of Premier Division status at the end of last season means that there will be two meetings this season, the first being the 2-2 draw at Scraley Road in January and the second, today's 18th meeting which is now as vital to us as were the 2017/18 games as we strive to preserve our Step 4 status.

In addition our Under 18s have twice visited Scraley Road in the FA Youth Cup, losing on both occasions and at Under 21/23 level 7 times in the now discontinued Isthmian Development Section with Borough having won 5, lost 1 with the other drawn.

HARINGEY BOROUGH V HEYBRIDGE SWIFTS 2017-2018



In the history of sport, I can't imagine there has been a more nail biting 4 game series in one season than the 2017-2018 battles between Haringey Borough and Heybridge Swifts. Each game filled with incident and across the 4 games there was triumph and heartbreak for both sides.

The first meeting with Heybridge that year was in the FA Cup 4th Qualifying Round on the 14th October, one step away from the coveted 1st Round Proper and the chance to draw a league team. For the Boro this was uncharted territory, as it was the



furthest we had ever been in the competition, to draw a side in your own division was disappointing, as I always feel in the cup you want to play teams that are unfamiliar, but it did present an incredible opportunity to progress, I am sure Heybridge felt the same. 401 supporters, which was a big crowd for us, saw Heybridge take the lead and go in at half time 1-0, Ralston Gabriel equalised before the hour mark, but 3 goals in 8 minutes killed it off for Heybridge and despite a late consolation through Ruaridh Kay, it was Heybridge that went through to the 1st Round 4-2, and our FA Cup run came to an end, first blood to Heybridge.

In the league we were going well and remained unbeaten until the 18th November when we did get beat by Brentwood Town, we then lost 4 on the trot going into the next Heybridge game away in the league on Tuesday 5th December. The reason for the poor run was down to one thing and one thing only, Valery Pajetet, Valery at the time was the world's greatest goalkeeper and when he got injured the week before we played Brentwood, such was his influence the team fell apart. The away game at Heybridge was fairly even although I seem to remember them having the better chances but it will be

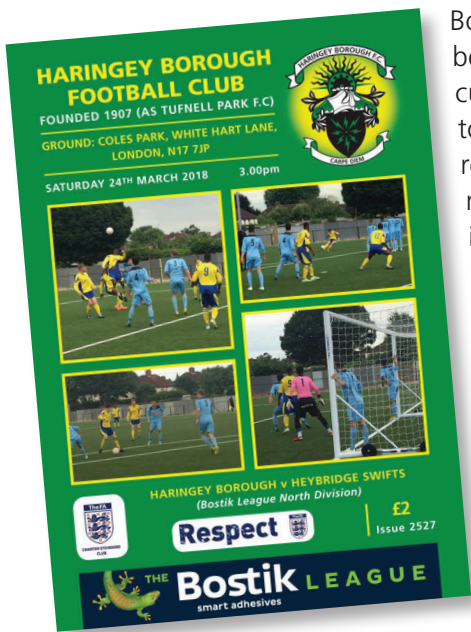


remembered because it didn't finish. A mass brawl in injury time saw the officials leave the pitch which allowed the players to get on with it.

Back in those days the fanbase away wasn't anywhere near what it is today, so given the Boro were seen as the perpetrator, we bowed our heads and left the ground. The journey home was one of amazement at what we had seen, my son who was 15 at the time thought it was the greatest night of his life. Aki wherever we went would have his phone out recording everything and anything, all our free-kicks, all our corners, all our penalties, hours upon hours of pointless clips, well when I say pointless, he just so happened to have filmed the incident leading up to the mass brawl and took great delight in whispering as I came through the turnstile for the next home game, here come and have a look at this. Anyway, the fallout was that the result stood at 0-0, Ralston was given a six match ban and the initial Heybridge player involved Juan Luque, also got banned. So, in the series it was still 1-0 to Heybridge after 2 games.

Leading into the next game which was in the league again on the 24th March, Heybridge were having a great season, but progress in the cups had meant they had a lot of games to play, we'd picked up the winning habit again and Tom just before the registration deadline pulled off what, in my opinion, won us promotion, the masterstroke of getting Mark Kirby, Andre McCollin and Chinedu McKenzie in to bolster the squad. Kirby and McCollin made their debuts against Heybridge and after being 2-0 up in the first half through Ralston and Anthony McDonald, Andre McCollin scored on 51 minutes to make it 3-0, we were playing really well and set for revenge at Coles Park for the FA Cup defeat. However, as we know with the





Boro, 3-0 up is the most dangerous scoreline for us, and that proved to be the case as Heybridge scored 3 goals in 8 minutes, a repeat of the cup tie, and they even had a player sent off before they scored their 3rd to make the game 3-3, and that is how it finished. This was no time to reflect on throwing a 3 goal lead away as there was a play off push to maintain and as it was, we won our next 10 games, to end the season in 4th place and a home tie in the play-offs. Heybridge also won 10 of their remaining games to finish 5th in the league table which meant an away play-off game against....The Boro!

While I type the hairs on the back of my neck are standing up. For me this is the best game I have been to at Coles Park, the excitement, the nervousness, the prize of getting to the play off final, the fact it was under the lights at home, made it an incredible atmosphere and an incredible night. It is also the most controlled I have ever known a Boro team to be, whatever was said in the dressing room and between the players worked a treat as I don't remember feeling concerned at all during the game, maybe nostalgia and the Boro tinted glasses are surfacing there.

On the night despite it being a great all round team performance, one man made it his mission to endear himself to the Boro faithful and ensure he is a future inductee into the Haringey Borough Hall of Fame. Step forward Jorge Djassi Sambu, now as we know Jorge is an imposing figure but on the night of Wednesday 2nd May 2018, Jorge seemed to grow another few inches, he was colossal, he was everywhere and most importantly he scored our two goals, two goals that have entered him into Boro folklore for which he is still reminded today with a song.

That game ended the series, four games, one win apiece and two draws, who got the better of the series? Well, we gained promotion following winning the play-off final but Heybridge got a tie away at Exeter City in the FA Cup, where they lost 3-1 but I am sure they would have had an unbelievable day and memories to last. The game earlier this season ended 2-2 so maybe today is a form of decider.

That such a team playing in an adult league should topple the League leaders on their home turf is nothing short of incredible and was the deserved result of their maturity, determination, teamwork, composure, discipline, concentration and, of course, their skill. After an even opening with both sides creating danger down the flanks it was Nia who put us ahead after 20 minutes as she cut in from the right to fire a cross shot high into the far corner. Royston equalised with a fine goal of their own and before half time took the lead from the penalty spot after Liamara clattered an attacker just inside the box. Fortunately the card was yellow. There was no let up in the intensity of the match after the interval with both sides creating many chances before, around the midway mark, Vedhika was first to react to a corner from the right and stabbed in our equaliser at the far post. Better was to follow ten minutes from time when Tara, taking advantage of the wind being in our favour, unleashed an effort on goal from around the half way line which bounced perfectly in front of the 'keepers left hand post and up into the top corner of the net and she could do no better than paw it against the inside of the post and it dropped into the net. WELL DESERVED RECOGNITION FOR KARLA

Founded in 2008 by sports journalists Leon Mann and Rodney Hinds, the FOOTBALL BLACK LIST was developed in response to the under representation of Black Professionals in influential, off the pitch roles within football. The List was inspired by the desire to acknowledge talent, challenge inequality and promote role models within the game. The Football Black List has become the most respected celebration of African and Caribbean achievement in the British game.

An independent panel of experts, drawn from across the football industry and the black community, voted and awarded a place on the List under the Community and Grassroots Section to KARLA PARKER who joined us 25 years ago and has at various times performed almost all roles possible both on and off the field. Were a list of "Done / not Done" functions prepared great would be the disparity in the length of the two columns. To mention but a few of those "Done" - Minibus Driver, Player Registrar, Physio, laundry woman, emergency goalkeeper, Social Media guru and most importantly (and currently) Secretary and Joint Manager. We hope that she will be with us for many more years and who would bet against the "not Done" column then being blank.

No "fair weather friend" is Karla – from time to time the Club has faced some very difficult periods interspersed with its successes, and it is questionable if it would have survived them were it not for Karla's determination that they should do so. Many successful and better known clubs just throw in the towel as soon as difficult times happen and continued glory can no longer be easily achieved; that has been the case with several of the Eastern Region Champions who have won promotion to the National League. In contrast we were promoted as Champions in 2016/17 but, having lost most of our best players in the close season, unsurprisingly lost every game played in 2017/18, many by double figures. It was Karla who somehow prevented morale collapsing and we fulfilled every fixture.

The List was published exclusively in the Voice Newspaper in the April addition as well as being published online on BBC sport and *Premierleague.com*.

The awards ceremony will be at the Football Black List celebration at Arsenal's Emirates stadium on Thursday 24 April 2025. However it is a "by invitation only" event so only Karla's Nominator - former player and now Head of Media Kiki, another quietly effective operator who backs up Bobby, Adem and Karla, will be able to accompany her.

HARINGEY PLAYER PROFILES 2024-25



GEORGIOS ARESTI – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal. Since leaving the Boro he has appeared for Cheshunt, Brightlingsea Regent and became the all-time top goal scorer for New Salamis.

BOBSON BAWLING – Bobson has had two spells with the Boro, a winger who previously played over 70 games in the football league for Crawley Town, scoring 6 goals. Other clubs Bobson has played for include Woking, Torquay United, Oxford City, St Albans City, Enfield Town, and Hendon. Known for his versatility, Bobson can play in various midfield positions and has also been deployed as a right-back.

TOMMY BOXER – An experienced centre back, Tommy was player-manager at New Salamis during the 2023/2024 season.
